Our Education Scholarship student Quynh has recently completed year 12 and has just been accepted into Danang University of Science and Technology to study Electronics and Telecommunications (Vietnamese-American Advanced Training Program). Quynh has been a Lifestart Foundation scholarship student since year 7 and she will be the first in her family to attend University.

We should never underestimate the importance of providing educational opportunities for young females in developing countries. Every girl who is provided with education is one less vulnerable woman of the future.

Quynh comes from a family of five, including her parents, her elder brother, her younger sister, and herself. Quynh's mother and father work really hard as rice farmers to make ends meet. Apart from working in the rice field, they also grow vegetables and raise chickens to earn extra income. Their meagre unstable income of only 4 million vnd or \$174 usd per month from farming work makes life very difficult for the family. It also means that it would be a challenge for the three children to get access to good educational opportunities like other students. Fortunately, since Quynh received her full LSF Education scholarship, her family's life has improved. The scholarship allowed Quynh to continue her studies in order to realise her dream of attending University.

During the last 6 years, Lifestart Foundation has witnessed Quynh grow into a capable young woman. She has been an excellent student for many years. Quynh completed a total of 8 hours of self-studying per day during normal weeks and on the days leading up to the exams, she self-studied up to 12 hours a day. Not only does Quynh strive to reach her own goals through her studies, but she also enjoys helping her classmates with their academic studies. Like other Vietnamese children, Quynh also helps her parents with light household chores such as cooking, washing dishes, and cleaning the house.

Quynh shared that her favourite subject is Maths and this has been the motivation for her to follow her chosen career path. She is determined to strive even harder at University so that she will be able to get a good job with a decent salary after graduation. Her hope for the future is to finally help herself and her family break the poverty cycle.

MEET VI – DOCTOR OF THE FUTURE

We have never doubted the profound importance of our Lifestart Foundation Medical Scholarships and our significant investment in the dedicated young people that we support. Over the years, Lifestart Foundation has provided 60 Medical Scholarships to outstanding students in Central Vietnam. All of our recipients demonstrate academic excellence and are from disadvantaged backgrounds.

Vi is currently a fifth-year General Medicine student at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy. She was another successful applicant of a LSF Medical Scholarship.

Vi was born and raised in a small village in Thang Binh district, Quang Nam, which is about 3 hours by bus from Hue. She comes from a large family of six, including her parents, her elder sister, her younger sister, her younger brother, and Vi.

As with all our scholarship students, Vi's family has a very difficult economic situation. Her family is deemed to be close-to-the-poor list by the government. In the past, her parents used to work as bridge and road workers in Danang so Vi and her elder sister lived with her grandparents.



Since Vi's younger sibling was born, her mother no longer worked in Danang and she mostly stayed at home to take care of the younger children. Due to her parent's ill health after many years doing heavy work, Vi's parents decided to work as labourers near their house instead of working far from home. The whole family lives on their meagre income, which pays for the family food, electricity, and school fees. Unfortunately, their limited salary wasn't enough to afford tuition fees and other associated fees related to the Pharmacy studies of her elder sister at Hue University and of Medicine and Pharmacy and for Vi's Medical University studies, so they borrowed large sums of money to support their children to continue their tertiary education. Both of Vi's younger siblings have health problems as does her father. The added costs of medication puts yet another strain on the family.

Not being discouraged by her disadvantaged family circumstances and the many challenges in her life, Vi has made every effort in her studies in order to realise her dream of becoming a skilled doctor. She achieved a GPA of 3.61 out of a possible 4.0 in the first semester of year 4, which is considered the heaviest year among her six years at university and she also ranked first in her class! Besides her academic studies, Vi also joins in extra-curricular activities at university such as donating blood and guiding her university freshmen. She is also an active member of the Internal Medicine Club at university.

We believe that with the support from the Lifestart Foundation Medical Scholarship, the financial distress of Vi's family has been lifted from her parents' shoulders. The scholarship from Lifestart Foundation covers all tuition, books, food allowance, rent costs, and also a laptop which will help her focus completely on her studies to achieve her desired goals.

Vi shared that she greatly admires her father. Despite coming from a disadvantaged background with limited education, he always knows how to rise above difficulties and encourages Vi and her siblings to study harder so as they will have a good future. This has motivated her to overcome a lot of challenges in her life and to realise her long-held and cherished dream of becoming a doctor, which will not only benefit herself and her family but more importantly the wider community.

Below is a beautiful letter of gratitude from Vi to Lifestart Foundation when she found out that she had been chosen for the scholarship. We hope you enjoy reading her letter of thanks. Stay tuned for more to come in future posts as we watch her progress with great interest.

Vi's thank-you letter:

Dear Ms. Karen and everyone at Lifestart Foundation,

My name is Nguyen Thi Thuy Vi. I am now a General Medicine student at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy.

In order to thank my sponsors, who so generously have donated my scholarship to attend university, and also a second-hand laptop, today I'm writing this letter to express my deep gratitude to Ms. Karen and the Lifestart Foundation. Besides expressing my gratitude, I would also like to share with you a little information about my life and my studies.

My family is like so many others, with dad, mum, and children - but I also feel that my family is really warm and happy. My father is a building worker, he is very hard-working and an honorable man as he has worked hard all his life to give his children a good education. Currently, he is unable to go to work a lot, due to bad weather and his health problems. My mother stays at home to look after my younger brother, who is just over 1 month old, and my younger sister who is 8 years old. When I came back home, my mother told me that she hopes my younger brother will grow up quickly so she can go to work to support us all.

My elder sister's current job is a good one because her company created good conditions making it possible for staff who want to work overtime to get more income. My family doesn't have farmland, but I hope that in the future I will be able to buy a small piece of land for my parents so that they can plant fresh vegetables and ensure good health for my family.

Regarding my studies, I still haven't taken the final exams of this semester. However, I have just finished some small tests in class and I did all of them well. I am very interested in some subjects, such as physiology and biochemistry. I realise that when we love something, we don't know exactly why we have such love - maybe I enjoyed the early lessons and the teachers. The knowledge I gain provides me with the background to help me to become a good doctor at the hospital. My studies have been quite good until now.

Besides going to the hospital, I am also participating in volunteer clubs, when I don't have any extra classes. Every day, I spend 1 hour practicing my listening skills and trying to translate English books. I plan to take an English course next year to improve my English. I study at the university from Monday to Friday and go on duty at the hospital in the evening, so I have limited self-study hours. When I am not on duty at the hospital, I will spend 4 hours on self-study, which increases to 9 hours on weekends.

Currently, gastrointestinal cancer has become more widespread and causes misery to patients and their families as well as the community, so I am planning to specialise in that area. In the future I want to become a Gastroenterology doctor, I hope that I can help patients overcome their pain. In addition, I also want to be able to communicate with people and help them understand the elements which cause their disease, to prevent the illness by changing their lifestyle.



I was so excited when I heard that I would receive this scholarship, I really thought that it was only a dream because this scholarship has such a huge value. I was extremely happy and quickly shared this news with my family. My parents were also very happy.

This scholarship is extremely valuable to disadvantaged students like me, helping my family by reducing the burden of my school fees and daily expenses. Moreover, I can have a better education and buy many more study supplies and materials. I am very grateful to Ms. Karen and Lifestart Foundation for their support and interest. The laptop I received from Lifestart Foundation helps me so much in my studies. I am trying my best to study well in order not to disappoint my parents, and to be worthy of the tremendous support from Ms. Karen and Lifestart Foundation.

Finally, I would like to sincerely thank you for your generosity. I wish you all good health and I trust that Lifestart Foundation will develop more and will be able to help a lot of other disadvantaged students.

I hope to see you all in the not too distant future.

Our Education Scholarship student Duyen has recently graduated from high school and has been accepted into Danang University of Medical Technology and Pharmacy to study Pharmacy. Duyen has been a Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship recipient since year 7 and she will be the first in her family to attend University.

Duyen was born into a very poor family in the countryside of Dien Ban. Her family includes her parents, her younger brother, and Duyen. Duyen's mother is the main breadwinner for the family. For a long time, her mum has had a herniated disc problem which worsens as she ages. Duyen's father unfortunately cannot work much due to

mental health problems. Her mother's meagre unstable income of only 2 million vnd or \$87 usd per month from farming work makes life very difficult for the family. Duyen shares the housework with her mum and she does one and a half hours of housework daily such as washing dishes, cleaning the house, washing clothes by hand, and feeding the pigs.

Being aware of her family situation, Duyen is determined to study diligently in order to help herself and her family break the poverty cycle. Every day, Duyen spent 7 hours on self-study, which is in addition to her tight schedule of studies at school and extra classes. On the days leading up to exams, she spent most of her awake time self-studying. The education scholarship awarded to Duyen has been a huge assistance for her and her family over the past 6 years and helped change their life for the better. The full scholarship covered Duyen's tuition fees, books, uniforms, supplies, and all of the important extra classes had to take to support her education. It is obvious that Duyen would not be able to achieve the study goals she is enjoying today without the wonderful help from her LSF scholarship.

Duyen's favourite subject is Chemistry and this has been a motivation for her to pursue her chosen career in Pharmacy - her long-held and cherished dream. Duyen is extremely grateful for the LSF scholarship as it not only helps her to improve her academic performance but also to receive lots of helpful advice and gain more experience in study and exams thanks to the support from LSF mentors.

I am very happy and I feel so lucky to become one of the fortunate recipients of Lifestart Foundation scholarship. This not only gives me very real motivation to study, but also it provides me with great spiritual strength which will help me overcome difficulties.

I have been working as a lecturer at Danang University of Medical Technology and Pharmacy for 7 years. Being a lecturer, I always try to study and improve my knowledge to increase my teaching qualifications. I want to improve the quality of the nursing staff in Vietnam and to develop a high-quality teaching team for my university, so I decided to attend the Master of Nursing course at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy, connected to the Khon Kaen University of Thailand.

With these financial pressures, I arranged to do a part-time job as a health visitor, to have extra income for my studies.

My family and I are very happy and grateful Ms. Karen and everyone at Lifestart Foundation. This scholarship is so precious and meaningful. It will help me to focus on my study during this difficult period. With this encouragement, I believe that I will complete my course well and after graduating, I will come back to work at Danang University of Medical Technology and Pharmacy. The first thing I will do is to share the new knowledge and skills that I have learned from the course with my colleagues who have not had this opportunity. I also believe that I am capable enough to contribute to training higher qualified nursing staff for Vietnam. I also believe that working with my university we can develop our training program to meet international standards.



Once again I would like to send my sincere thanks to Karen and Lifestart Foundation. I wish you all good health, happiness, and peace. I hope that the foundation will have more and more success in the future to be able to support Vietnamese students who are in need during their studies.

Our Education Scholarship student Binh has completed year 12 and has recently commenced his first year studying Nursing at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy. He has held a full Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship since year 7 and is the first in his family to attend University.

Not as fortunate as other children, Binh comes from a single-parent family. He lives with his elderly grandmother who is 91 years old and his mother who is the sole breadwinner of the family. The family lives on her meagre unstable monthly income of 3 million dong

or \$130 usd from farming work. To share the burden with his mother, Binh also spends 1 hour a day helping her with household tasks such as cooking, cleaning the house, and washing clothes by hand.

Before receiving the Lifestart Foundation scholarship, Binh neither had an opportunity to attend the all-important extra classes nor did he have a means of transport to get to school. The scholarship granted to Binh has alleviated the financial burden on his mother's shoulders. It covered all of his tuition fees, books, uniforms, stationery and also enabled him to enroll in extra classes that he had always hoped to join. In addition, Binh was also given a new bicycle to help him make it to his school and his extra classes on time without having to be reliant on others.

Binh is extremely grateful for the wonderful help from Lifestart Foundation he has received since secondary school. The scholarship has given him a source of motivation to strive harder to eventually gain acceptance to study at University. Binh



has been an excellent student for many years. Binh completed a total of 8 hours of self-studying per day during normal weeks and on the days leading up to the exams, he self-studied up to 11 hours a day. He received a GPA of 8.8 out of a possible 10 in year 12. After studying and revising diligently in year 12 despite the impacts of the Covid-19 pandemic, he successfully passed the High school Graduation Exam and was accepted to study Nursing at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy. Binh is full of determination to strive even harder at University so that he will be able to get a good job with a decent salary after graduation.

MEET HONG – A JAPANESE LANGUAGE INTERPRETER OF THE FUTURE – BEFORE AND NOW

Hong is currently a third-year University student majoring in Japanese studies at Danang University of Foreign Language Studies.

It has been a nine-year journey that Lifestart Foundation has walked with Hong and witnessed her growth from a young girl in year 7 to the outstanding young adult that she is today.

Hong comes from an extremely disadvantaged family. There are 6 people in her family: her grandmother, her parents, her elder brother, her younger brother, and herself. Both her father and mother are rice farmers who rely on their crops and livestock farming to make ends meet.

To earn extra income to support their entire family, Hong's father works as a builder's assistant while her mother sells soya milk.

Before receiving her scholarship, Hong neither had an opportunity to attend the all-important extra classes nor she was able to purchase enough stationery that was essential for her studies due to her difficult situation. Her parents' total income, combined with the salary of her elder brother earned through working at a factory, only equaled a monthly income of \$135. Unfortunately, her mother has suffered from colitis for a long time and her father has an eye condition and is not well after eye surgery. Paying for their monthly medication costs is another additional financial burden on the family. As a result, her family has always been in an extremely challenging situation and they had to borrow money from relatives to pay for Hong's tuition fees and other educational expenses.

Fortunately, a huge financial burden was alleviated from Hong's parents' shoulders when she received a full Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship in year 7. They no longer needed to worry about education costs for their academically gifted daughter and they were able to reallocate money to much-needed food and medical expenses for the family.

Hong's life and studies have turned a whole new page since then. Each school year the Education Scholarship paid for her tuition fees, uniforms, stationery and also allowed Hong to attend the all-important and expensive extra classes necessary to complete her education.



Hong was a gifted language student and was quite proficient in English during her high school years. Besides English, she loves exploring other cultures as well. A subsequent full scholarship from Lifestart Foundation's generous supporters has helped Hong to continue her tertiary education majoring in Japanese at Danang University of Foreign Language Studies.

Hong loves the Japanese language so much and she is in the process of realising her goal of becoming a qualified Japanese language interpreter. Despite the challenges she has to face in her life, Hong has always shown academic excellence. Every day she completes 7-8 hours of self-study and 9-10 hours on the days leading to her exams. As a result of her diligence, she achieved an excellent GPA of 3.89 out of a possible 4.0 in the first semester of year 2.

To Hong, "her scholarship is not only a material support but also a spiritual encouragement for her to study and overcome difficulties in life."

It's been an absolute pleasure for all the team at Lifestart Foundation to accompany the passionate and committed Hong over the past years and to watch her significant progress into becoming a promising interpreter of the future. Buu has held a full Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship since year 9. He has now completed year 12 at Le Thanh Tong High school for Gifted Students and has been accepted into Danang University of Science and Technology to study Electronics and Telecommunications (Vietnamese-American Advanced Training Program).

As with all of our scholarship students, despite enormous odds stacked against them they continue to inspire us with their accomplishments and determination.

Buu comes from a large family of eight, including his grandmother, his parents, four elder sisters, and Buu. His grandmother is elderly and stays at home under the care of his parents. Both Buu's father and mother are rice farmers who work extremely hard in the fields to support their entire family. In the past, his father also worked as a builder's assistant during the summer season to earn extra income for the family. Before Buu was awarded a full LSF scholarship, his family really struggled to meet the financial commitments for their family. Their modest income only allowed a little over \$1 per day per person for each family member to live on, which made it extremely challenging for them to manage their daily life while having to support their three younger children with their education expenses. It also meant that Buu couldn't get access to good education opportunities like other students.

Despite his disadvantaged background, Buu has always shown academic excellence. The full LSF Education Scholarship has been a strong motivation for Buu to strive harder to become a successful scholar and to lift his family out of the poverty cycle. During his high school years, he also won several prizes in the provincial contests for excellent students and the annual 30th April Olympic contest in Ho Chi Minh. Every day he spent 5-6 hours self-studying. On the days leading up to the exams, he spent 7 hours on self-study. As a result of his diligence and determination, Buu achieved a GPA of 8.7 out of a possible 10 in year 12 and was accepted to Danang University of Science and Technology to study Electronics and



Telecommunications (Vietnamese-American Advanced Training Program) after having successfully passed the National High school Graduation Exam.

Congratulations Buu, we believe that the full support from Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship, it will inspire him to even loftier heights. His elder sister, also named Buu, was also supported by LSF to complete her eighteen-month international training and apprentice program in professional cooking at Streets International. Since graduation, she has found employment at a well-known resort in Ninh Thuan. It's always wonderful to witness the growth of our scholarship students from extreme poverty to the success they achieve today.

EDUCATING YOUNG FEMALES TO REACH THEIR FULL POTENTIAL MEET NHUNG – THEN & NOW

Nhung was born and raised in a very poor family in the countryside of Duy Xuyen. Not as fortunate as other children, Nhung comes from a single-parent family and she lives with her grandparents and her mother. Her grandparents are elderly so they cannot work anymore. Nhung's mother, who is the sole

breadwinner for the family, works as a tailor during the day and she makes pork rolls at night to earn extra income. She suffers from arthritis which causes her problems when she walks and limits her capacity to work. Unfortunately, the Covid-19 pandemic came and it has had a major impact on her family. The ongoing difficulties have left the family of four deprived of their only source of income. Currently, the whole family lives on Nhung's mother's meagre income of only 1.5 million vnd or \$65usd per month from repairing clothes and a few pork roll orders each month.

Before receiving the Lifestart Foundation scholarship, Nhung didn't have the opportunity to have access to good learning conditions. Her mother had to borrow money to pay for Nhung's extra classes. After going through a knee surgery several years ago, her mother couldn't work too much so in order to share the burden with her, Nhung assisted at local weddings and worked part-time during Tet holidays to earn some more money for the family.

Nhung was recommended to Lifestart Foundation by her secondary school when she had finished Year 7. She met all of our criteria for a scholarship and has proved to be an outstanding and worthy recipient. Nhung officially received her full Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship in Year 8. Since then, a huge pressure has been lifted from her mother's shoulders. Nhung is extremely grateful for the support from LSF as her mother no longer had to worry about her studies and she didn't have to borrow money to pay for Nhung's classes anymore. The scholarship covers Nhung's tuition fees, books, uniforms, supplies, and all of the important extra classes she had to take to support her education.

Nhung is currently studying in year 11. She is a brilliant student who has achieved the title of excellent student for many years. In addition to attending classes at school and the all-important extra classes outside of school, Nhung completes 5 hours of self-study per day and 8 hours on the days leading up to the exams. As a result of her diligence, she achieved a GPA of 9.2 out of a possible 10 in year 10.

Nhung's favourite subject is English. She has attended many competitions in English and has won lots of prizes at district and province levels. She is now the sole breadwinner of the family and despite her poor health, she works as a shop assistant to earn an income to support her family. To share the burden with his mother, Thanh also helps her with household tasks every day.

Not being discouraged by his situation, Thanh has always tried his best with his studies in hope of eventually being able to help his family break the poverty cycle. On the days leading to the National High school Graduation Exam – the most important exam in a student's life, he spent 11 hours on self-study by doing mock tests and revising theoretical knowledge. His favourite subjects are Maths, Chemistry, and Biology the most, which suits his dream of pursuing a career in Medicine. It is obvious that Thanh wouldn't be able to reach his dream without the significant help from his LSF Education Scholarship. Every school year, the full scholarship paid for Thanh's tuition fees, books, uniforms, supplies, and all of the important extra classes he had to take to support his education. The scholarship from LSF has given him a lot of motivation to study and to continue to achieve excellent results.

DOCTOR OF THE FUTURE - MEET QUYNH

Lifestart Foundation awarded a new round of major Medical and Pharmacy Scholarships for 9 super impressive students at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy, who have demonstrated academic excellence and are all from extremely disadvantaged backgrounds.

Quynh was another successful candidate in this round of interviews for the <u>#Medical</u> Scholarships.

She has just finished her fourth year and recently commenced her fifth year studying General Medicine. Quynh is the first in her family to attend University.

Like all of our scholarship students, Quynh comes from an extremely disadvantaged family. There are four people in her family, including her parents, her younger brother, and herself. In the past, her father was a carpenter but due to ill health, he has not been able to continue this heavy work. All of the family responsibilities and financial burdens are on her mother's shoulders and she is the main breadwinner for the family. The family's income is only 3,100,000 vnd or approximately \$134 usd per month, which makes it very difficult for them to support their children with their schooling while having to manage their daily expenses. Her younger brother was born with a cleft palate, now although he has undergone the surgery his health is not great and he usually has ear infections. Her father and her brother's monthly medication costs are an additional financial burden to manage.

Despite that, her parents still sent her and her brother to school with the hope that in the future, their children would have a brighter future. When Quynh began university, the family financial situation became worse and worse as there are too many expenses to pay for her education. To make ends meet, her mum has also raised a flock of chickens to get eggs and sell to earn extra income. But this was still not enough to cover the expenses, so her family decided to borrow a large sum of money from one of their relatives to pay for their children's school fees, medications, and other living expenses. To share the burden with her mother, every year before Tet holiday Quynh also makes handcrafted products to sell and she helps her mum to sell vegetables at the local market.

Despite her difficult situation, Quynh is determined and full of energy and enthusiasm.

Different from most university students, Quynh took the university exam twice in order to reach her dream of studying medicine. She is a brilliant and extremely hard-working student. She achieved an excellent GPA of 3.88 out of a possible 4.0 in the second semester of Year 2. Besides attending tutorials at school and doing clinical practice at hospitals, she spends a total of approximately 70 hours a week self-studying on normal weeks. On the days leading up to the exams, she spends 105 hours a week on self-study. Such dedication! Apart from academic studies, Quynh also actively participates in volunteer activities such as donating blood or helping people in need in the community.

Quynh was extremely grateful when she knew she would receive such a valuable education scholarship from Lifestart Foundation. To Quynh, this is a life-changing scholarship, which came to her and her family when they needed it the most. The full Lifestart Foundation Medical Scholarship covers all of her tuition fees, books, rent, food allowance, and also a new laptop, which will be a great additional tool for her studies.

Quynh shared that Medicine has been her passion and cherished dream since a very young age. At present, she is really interested in Obstetrics so she has been putting 100% effort into her studies in hope of becoming a skilled obstetrician in the future. Now with the wonderful support from Lifestart Foundation, Quynh is full of determination and motivation to realise her dream.

Quynh's Thank-you Letter:



Dear Ms. Karen and everyone at Lifestart Foundation,

My name is Phan Thi Nhu Quynh. I am currently in class Y45, majoring in General Medicine at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy.

First of all, I would like to send my regards and my sincere thanks to you for your precious scholarship. Then, I want to share with you some information about my life as well as my studies.

I was born and raised in a small village of Phu Loc town in Thua Thien Hue province. My family's situation is extremely difficult as my dad has had osteoarthritis in his knees for 4 years. Unable to work, he stays at home now doing some light tasks and raising chickens. My mum has a degenerative disc disease and is currently selling vegetables in a market to make a living. My youngest sibling is in year 6 and his study performance in the first semester is quite good.

At school, my schedule is very busy with doing clinical practice at a hospital in the morning, studying theory at school in the afternoon and being on duty at a hospital, or attending English classes in the evening. No matter how hectic it is, I always try to manage my schedule so that I can have more time for self-study. Every day, I spend about 7- 8 hours doing self-study.

The amount of medical knowledge is enormous but I do not have much time to study at school so self-study is very important for me so I always try to arrange my schedule and make plans for myself in terms of my studies as well as my life.

Since I entered the university, I have been extremely interested in learning Obstetrics. Last semester, I did clinical practice in Obstetrics and had great opportunities to practice and better understand this major. During my clinical practice period, I was involved in delivering babies and witnessing a caesarean section which I found really interesting. The feeling of assisting a mother give birth to a baby was extremely moving and made me feel more thankful to my mum for her great effort to give birth to me. Perhaps because of my affection and interest in Obstetrics, I achieved a very good final result in this subject.

Last semester, I achieved a good GPA of 3.44 out of a possible 4. The study program for the first semester included Paediatrics and Obstetrics which I found quite difficult. Paediatrics is a subject including many difficult topics and the clinical practice period in it was longer compared to others. Despite those hardships I had to encounter during the first semester, I put my best effort into my studies and the final result I achieved was good. I will continue trying my utmost to study diligently so that I can improve my academic performance in the second semester.

Besides studying at school, I also practice my English skills as I understand that English is very important for my current studies as well as my future employment. Last semester, I did a Toeic preparation course and found it really helpful; my English skills have improved a lot, especially my pronunciation, writing, and listening skills. I will try to study harder and spend more time practicing English to enhance my skills this semester.

Currently, I am joining a study club – the "Internal Medicine" club at school. Thanks to this club, I have gained a lot of useful knowledge from other seniors and students as well as making many new friends. Furthermore, when taking part in this club, I have also had the chance to give a presentation in front of other members there, which has helped me to become more confident and to improve my public speaking skills.

The year 2020 was such a traumatic one for us all as we had to fight against not only the Covid 19 pandemic but also natural disasters. However, I still feel very satisfied with my studies and my life during last year as everything went quite well. More importantly, last year I was truly fortunate to receive a precious scholarship from Lifestart Foundation which is one of the greatest happiness that I have ever had. I was really thrilled when receiving the news from Lifestart Foundation that I had an opportunity for a scholarship interview in Hoian. And after the interview, I burst with joy and was so proud of myself after receiving an email announcing that I would be presented with the valuable scholarship and a new laptop which has enabled me to have better study conditions, to take an English course, and to cover my living expenses! The burden of my study expenditure has been greatly reduced from my parents' shoulders.

This semester, I will continue to put my best efforts into my studies. I am studying 3 subjects: Internal and External Medicine, and Scientific Research Methodology. My plan is to spend more time studying Internal and External Medicine as these are very difficult subjects, and I aim to achieve a GPA of 3.6. I also plan to take a 2-month Pre-lelts course this



April to improve my English skills. I will also spend time doing more voluntary work and other activities held by my class and my school.

Once again, I would like to send my sincere thanks to Ms. Karen and everyone at Lifestart Foundation for your kind help and great support. I wish you all good health and success in life. Hopefully, Lifestart Foundation will become successful and be able to support more students in difficult situations.

Our Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship student Dieu Linh is currently studying in year 12 at Le Thanh Tong High school for Gifted Students in Hoi An.

Linh has held a full Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship since year 7.

Linh met our criteria for a Lifestart Foundation Scholarship: being from an extremely disadvantaged background, being academically gifted, and having a strong desire to give back

to the community via her chosen career path.

Linh lives with her grandmother, her parents, and her younger brother in her hometown Dien Ban. Before she was granted the valuable Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship, her family faced many challenges – her parents are both rice farmers trying to raise and educate their two children with their meagre unstable income of only 4,000,000 vnd or \$174 usd per month. With this modest income, Linh's parents sometimes needed to borrow money from relatives to manage their children's school fees as well as to pay for books, uniforms, and stationery.

The life of Linh and her family turned to a new page since receiving the Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship! Linh shared with Lifestart Foundation that "the Education Scholarship she has received is a tremendous support which she and her family couldn't be more thankful for". It has helped relieve her parents' worry about their children's education expenses. Every year, the LSF scholarship has paid for all of Linh's tuition fees, books, stationery, uniforms, and the all-important extra classes she has to take to support her education.

With the help from the scholarship, Linh's mum was able to reallocate money for other necessary expenses and save enough money to open a food stall selling Quang noodles in Hoi An. They were also provided relief hampers and financial aid from Lifestart Foundation, her sponsor, and generous donors to overcome challenges in their life.

Linh is a brilliant student. She has received the title of excellent student for the last 11 continuous years. In year 11, she achieved a GPA of 9.1 out of a possible 10, ranking her third in her class. Each day Linh spends 7 hours at home doing her homework and self-study and also 1.5 hours helping her mum with household chores such as cooking, tidying the house, and assisting in cooking Quang noodles.

Linh has held a strong passion for taking care of her family members and the wider community since a young age. She is extremely motivated to study diligently to become a doctor in the future so that she can support her family and to help many disadvantaged people as well.

DOCTOR OF THE FUTURE - INTRODUCING TAM

Tam is currently a fourth-year General Medicine student at Danang University of Medical Technology and Pharmacy. She has successfully passed the interview for a Lifestart Foundation Medical Scholarship which will support her studies throughout her 4 remaining years

at university.

Tam comes from Dak Nong Province in the Central Highlands, which is about 17 hours by bus from Danang. As with all of our Education Scholarship students, Tam comes from a disadvantaged family. Her parents are both farmers who work really hard on the fields to make

ends meet. Their monthly joint income of 6 million vnd or \$260 usd made it extremely challenging for them to manage their daily life while having to support Tam with her expensive six-year medical studies. Unfortunately, her father is suffering from complications from a serious stroke in 2018 and her mother has had stomach problems for a long time so paying for their monthly medication costs is another additional financial burden on the family.

Different from most university students, Tam took the university exam twice in order to reach her dream of studying medicine. Despite her difficult family situation, Tam is motivated to study diligently in order to break the poverty cycle for her family. Besides attending tutorials at school and doing clinical practice at the hospital, she spends a total of approximately 40 hours a week self-studying during normal weeks. On the days leading up to the exams, she spends 65 hours a week on self-study. She achieved a GPA of 3.38 out of a possible 4.0 in the first semester of year 3.

Tam really admires Ton That Tung, a Vietnamese surgeon who lived in the 20th century. He was a pioneer in liver anatomy and liver surgery. Despite the lack of medical supplies, his commitment to surgical science and, more importantly, to the Vietnamese people stands as a tribute to the tireless pursuit of his ideals. He has been strong motivation for Tam to strive harder in her studies in order to reach her long-held and cherished dream of becoming a skilled doctor.

We believe that with the support from the Lifestart Foundation education scholarship, the financial distress of her family has been lifted from her parents' shoulders. The Medical scholarship covers her tuition fees, books, rent, food allowance and also enables Tam to take some time off from work so she can fully concentrate on her studies.

At this stage, Tam is interested in Cardiology so she hopes to study more about this field in the future.

Tam's thank-you letter:

Dear Karen and Lifestart Foundation,

I'm Nguyen Thanh Tam, a student majoring in general medicine at DaNang University of Medical Technology and Pharmacy. I was one of the lucky students to receive a scholarship from Lifestart Foundation. I was very surprised and delighted, and I would like to send my sincere thanks to Ms. Karen and Lifestart Foundation for choosing me as one of the scholarship recipients.

I am the youngest member of a farming family in the Central Highlands and am studying in DaNang. My family of five includes my dad and mum who are now living in Dak Nong, growing coffee and pepper. My elder sister is married and both of them are workers and my elder brother is working in information technology in a shoe manufacturing company.

Going to a big city to study, at first I was very nervous and worried about many things such as where should I stay? Is it difficult to study Medicine? Would my parents be able to pay my fees for me on time or not? I was very homesick. However, after two and a half years of studying at university, I was much less worried, my studies were gradually more stable, and staying in a dormitory was very convenient for studying and participating in activities at university. Currently, I have moved out because the university's dormitory is being repaired. I had a lot of difficulties in finding a rented room and these are more costly than the dormitory. However, I have arranged a room and feel secure to focus on my self-studying for the final exam of this first semester.



This year has been a difficult one for my family. They grow coffee and pepper, but this year's weather is very harsh and unpredictable; drought, rain, and storms happen alternately all year.

In order to reduce a bit of the financial burden on my family, I went to work part-time. My job is tutoring, and this work has helped me a lot, each month I receive an average salary of 800,000VND. In addition, it also helps me practice my speaking, communication, and persistence skills. However, in the near future, I need to spend more time studying so I will stop doing this job.

Due to my family having difficulties for many years, they are still on the poor list in our village.

This scholarship is a huge gift for me and my family. When I informed my family of this news, my parents and my elder brother were very excited, emotional, and not forgetting to send thanks to Ms. Karen and Lifestart Foundation.

Before going to the interview, I worried a lot and looked for articles on the Internet about scholarship interviews, but then I realized that I just need to practice speaking fluently, coherently, and clearly, expressing my thoughts correctly. That is the best way I can express what I think, as honestly as I can. During the interview, I did not feel nervous anymore, the staff helped me a lot, they always smiled and explained everything enthusiastically to me. I just needed to listen and answer in what I thought was the most appropriate way. After the interview had finished, I felt very comfortable. I had the opportunity to share about my own weaknesses, my family circumstances, and my future plans. Besides that, Ms. Karen also gave me solutions to help me overcome those weaknesses. I showed myself as honestly as I could, and it made me comfortable after the interview.

When I got the email from Lifestart Foundation about receiving the scholarship, I was so surprised and did not believe that I had been chosen to be a recipient. I was very emotional, so from now on my parents have reduced a part of the burden of paying school fees for me. I'm really happy because I will have great support on my difficult and rough path ahead.

For me, the scholarship is meaningful both mentally and materially. It shows me that there are still a lot of good people around who are willing to help, support, and understand the difficulties that my family and I are facing. They show kind-heartedness and generosity without needing any repayment and I will try to study hard to become a useful person to society in the future. The scholarship is a great support that will help my studies in the future. In addition, I have the chance to get to know many seniors from previous courses and make new friends. I will also find out from them how much effort they have made to maintain good study results. Regarding my family, my parents were very emotional to hear about Lifestart Foundation Scholarship because they will not have to worry about the tuition fees for me every semester. Thanks to the scholarship my future plans can be completed earlier than expected, taking an English course is something I have cherished for a long time, and now I'm ready to register for my course in the future.

This is my story about myself and my family. I would like to send my deepest thanks to Ms. Karen and I hope to be able to meet you soon. Thank you Lifestart Foundation staff in Hoi An for helping me a lot. Wishing Ms. Karen and the Lifestart Foundation a lot of good health and good luck!

Hieu, who has received a full Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship since year 7, is one of our excellent <u>#IT</u> scholarship students.

Hieu was born into a poor family of six, including his parents, his two grandmothers his elder brother, and Hieu. Hieu's parents are rice farmers and they work extremely hard every day just to cover their family's expenses. Hieu's grandmothers do not have very good health which means the family frequently has the extra costs of health treatment fees for them. In the past, Hieu and his elder brother used to work to share the burden with their parents so they didn't have much time for study.

The Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship awarded to Hieu when he was thirteen years of age was the light at the end of the tunnel. Each year the Lifestart Foundation scholarship paid for his tuition fees, the all-important additional extra classes, uniforms, shoes, and books. This took a huge financial weight off the shoulders of his family and he was also provided with the best possible learning conditions.



Hieu is currently a senior at University, majoring in Information Technology, and is a diligent, well-rounded student. He spends at least 5 hours a day on self-study. to mention the tuition fees for her elder sister who is also a General Medicine student at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy. In addition, the debt for borrowing money to buy a coffee land and other necessary farm work expenditures, as well as repair to their old and flimsy house, has put her family in an extremely difficult situation. To have enough money to cover her own living expenses, Tram had to work part-time as a tutor. She tried very hard to manage her busy schedule at university and at work so that she could both survive and hopefully achieve excellent students.

Not being discouraged by her difficult situation, Tram has always shown academic excellence. She achieved an outstanding GPA of 3.7 out of a possible 4.0 when she received her LSF scholarship. Every day Tram spends about 4-6 hours on self-study. On the days leading to the exams, she completes 10 hours of self-study, which is in addition to her tight schedule at school and the hospital's rounds. Besides her hectic studies, Tram also participates in extracurricular activities helping patients in need, and she also joined the Cardiology club and Internal Medicine Club.

After receiving the life-changing LSF education scholarship, Tram's life has changed for the better. Her parents no longer had to not worry about Tram's tuition fees and living expenses, instead, they can focus on working to pay back the debt and reallocate money for their two other children. 

Everyone was very happy, too, and my mum cried. The scholarship will help me a lot in my study journey and reduce a lot of burden for my parents so as they can focus on supporting my sister and my brother as well as their life in my hometown. On the scholarship presentation day, we were given such a big surprise from Lifestart Foundation, which was a new laptop. This will be a meaningful friend to me, supporting my study a lot.

We are so very proud of her accomplishment and the young woman she has grown into.

Trieu is the first in her family to graduate from university.

Trieu has held a full Lifestart Foundation education scholarship since she was in Year 8. From when each student is initially awarded a Lifestart Foundation scholarship it is a very long journey for both our team who are involved in every aspect of the students' education journey and also for the sponsor.

It can take up to twelve years before students graduate from University, but when they do we are all "over the moon" with happiness, and know that we have helped another young person to break the poverty cycle via education. Trieu is the first in her family to graduate from university.

We first met Trieu many years ago, her parents had divorced when Trieu was 2 years old and since then, Trieu and her sister had not seen their father and rarely saw their mother. They lived with their elderly grandmother since their parents divorced. Their grandmother used to work as a farmer to support their living expenses and school fees.

Trieu's grandmother now has rheumatism and is no longer able to work. Despite being a good student unfortunately Trieu's sister had to leave school in year 10 due to a lack of finances.



Trieu has lived with her grandmother in a small room at the side of her uncle's house. Her parents now have new families and they do not support Trieu. When Trieu was introduced to us the family only had enough money for her to eat only two small bowls of food per day. Trieu was quite malnourished but never complained and instead focused her energy on her studies.

Fortunately, a huge financial burden was lifted from Trieu's grandmother's shoulders when Trieu received a full Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship. She no longer needed to worry about education costs for her granddaughter. Each school year the Education Scholarship paid for her tuition fees, uniforms, stationery and also allowed Trieu to attend the all-important and expensive extra classes necessary to complete her education, giving her great hope and confidence for the future.

After graduation, Trieu has been offered a full-time position at a Japanese IT company in Danang. Her daily duties include writing and executing test cases based on the documents given by the customers, tracking any bugs that have arisen via the test case system as well as reporting defects, and communicating with Japanese customers regarding the issues during the processes, all in Japanese!

MEET HIEN - A PHARMACIST OF THE FUTURE

In 2021, Lifestart Foundation awarded a new round of major Medical and Pharmacy Scholarships for 9 super impressive students at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy, who have demonstrated academic excellence and are all from extremely disadvantaged backgrounds. By way of their chosen vocation, they also meet our criteria of completing a degree in an area that will not only benefit themselves and their families in the future but more importantly the wider community.

Hien was a compelling candidate in this round of interviews and she is one of our first two Pharmacy Education Scholarship recipients at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy.

Hien comes from a small village in the Central province of Hue. Due to her mother's ill health and the family's limited income of 6 million vnd per month, it has been very hard for them to manage their family's daily expenses while having to support Hien with her medical studies, and their other child who is still attending school. In order to keep their children in school and to pay for the family's expenses, her parents had to apply for several big loans, which has made their lives all the more difficult.

Hien is extremely diligent and determined to break the poverty cycle for her family, and she is the first in her family to attend university. Every day she spends 6 hours self-studying at home. This is on top of over 50 hours of classes at school and clinical practice at hospitals each week.

Hien takes her studies very seriously. Without a doubt, she has always shown excellent academic achievements throughout her university years. She achieved a GPA of 3.61 out of a possible 4.0 when she was awarded her Lifestart Foundation scholarship.

Hien shared with us that this is a "life-changing" scholarship for her, as she has never received such enormous financial support before. Besides covering all tuition fees, rent, and food allowance, the Lifestart Education scholarship also enables Hien to take some time off from working part-time so that she can completely focus on her studies to achieve the best results.

Hien has a great interest in Pharmacognosy - the study of medicines produced from natural sources such as plants, microbes, and animals. The scholarship from Lifestart Foundation allows Hien to continue to follow her dreams of becoming a skilled Pharmacist not only to help her parents improve their health but also to contribute to the well-being of society. With the full support from Lifestart Foundation, we believe that this will inspire her to even greater heights.

HIEN'S THANK-YOU LETTER:

Dear Karen and everyone at Lifestart Foundation,

This is Nguyen Thi Kim Hien, a Pharmacy student in year 3 at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy. Today I'm writing this letter to express my gratitude and send my deepest thanks to Ms. Karen and Lifestart Foundation's staff. My family and I would like to thank everyone because you all believed in me and have given me this scholarship. It was a great motivation for me and my family. Besides that, I would also like to share with you all some news about myself and my family situation.

My family has 5 people including my parents and 3 siblings. I'm the oldest one in my family. Although my parents are elderly, they still have to work hard to support us. My dad is working as a taxi driver and my mum is selling veggies at a local market near our house. Last year, due to the effect of Covid-19 epidemic and unpredictable weather, my family got into some financial difficulties and they found it hard to cover their daily expenses. My younger brother is doing military service and the youngest one is in year 10. He has settled down well and plans to take the entrance exam to his preferred university in the future.

At the moment, I am in year 3 and have started learning specialized subjects, so my schedule is quite busy. After having studied a few specialized subjects, I have become interested in herbal medicine as I know herbs are effective in treating diseases and have fewer side effects than Western medicine. As a result, I plan to find jobs related to the herbal section in the future.



After my Lifestart Foundation scholarship interview, I was a bit worried about my result but more importantly, I felt very comfortable because I could share my thinking and emotion with Ms. Karen. The interview went very easily and I did not feel nervous anymore because Ms. Karen and the staff were very friendly. They always smiled and explained everything enthusiastically to me. After I heard the news that I had passed the interview, my family and I were really excited and happy. From the bottom of my heart, I was very appreciative of the Lifestart Foundation. Initially, when I heard that I would be chosen to participate in the interview in Hoi An, I was very delighted but I did not tell my parents because I was afraid that the more hope they put in me, the sadder they would be if I did not pass the interview. Luckily, I was chosen to be a Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship recipient. I was really thankful to Lifestart Foundation for awarding me this scholarship as it is very meaningful to me and my family.

Lifestart Foundation education scholarship has a big value, not only in material terms, providing me with support for my daily living expenses and my study, but also as a motivation for me to study harder in the future so as not to disappoint anyone. It will help my family escape from the poverty cycle. My parents can now focus on their work to earn more and pay off the debt of my family. They are less stressed than before, so they feel very happy and more comfortable as the financial burden has been lifted from their shoulders. In addition, I am very glad because I have helped my parents.

Over the past 22 years, Lifestart Foundation has provided hundreds of Education Scholarships to disadvantaged students in Central Vietnam to help them complete their education. It's a long road we walk with our scholarship students and it can often be more than a 10-year journey.

Toai, who has received a full Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship since year 7, is one of our excellent **#Electronics** scholarship students. He is currently a fifth-year student at Danang University of Science and Technology.

Toai comes from a poor family of 4, including his parents, his elder brother, and Toai. Sadly, Toai's elder brother passed away a few years ago after being bedridden with acute Cerebral Palsy for over 20 years. Like many of our scholarship students, his parents are rice farmers who never had the opportunity to complete their education so they work very hard every day to be able to support their family.

To add to the worry for his family, Toai has a tumor on the brain which has dramatically impacted his health over many years. Fortunately, it is not malignant and he has been sent to Ho Chi Minh City for treatment many times. At present, his health has improved after the treatment he has received, and now he needs to go to Ho Chi Minh City less frequently.

The Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship awarded to Toai when he was thirteen years of age was the light at the end of the tunnel. Each year the Lifestart Foundation scholarship paid for his tuition fees, the all-important additional extra classes, uniforms, shoes, and books. This took a huge financial weight off the shoulders of his family and he was also provided with the best possible learning conditions. The subsequent full university scholarship has carried him right through his tertiary education without having to worry about borrowing money or working part-time to cover his expenses.

Toai is now a final year student at Danang University of Science and Technology with his major being Electronics and Telecommunication. Despite having frequent interruptions to his study due to his health, Toai is a diligent and excellent student. He spends at least 5 hours a day on self-study. His accumulated GPA up to now is 3.49 out of a possible 4.0 – achieving the title of very good student.

Currently, Toai is doing an internship at a company in Danang and he specializes in Physical Design for Chips – his favourite Electronic field. He is eager to become a qualified Electronics engineer to earn an income to support his family, and positively impact their economic situation in the future.

DOCTOR OF THE FUTURE - MEET DINH

At Lifestart Foundation, **Education Scholarships** are our largest and most important project as we believe that via education we can break the poverty cycle for future generations. We also believe that by nurturing and encouraging fine minds in particular in the health sector, we will help the development of Vietnam and its people.

Dinh was another successful applicant for a Lifestart Foundation Medical Scholarship.

As with all our scholarship students, Dinh's family has a very difficult economic situation. His family is on the poor list of the government.

Dinh comes from a single-parent family. His parents divorced when he was 14 years old and he has been living with his father since then, while his mother has moved on and has started a new family. His father is disabled after losing his leg in an accident. Unfortunately, he is not able to work a lot which restricts his ability to support his three children who are all still going to school.

Prior to receiving the Lifestart Foundation Scholarship, Dinh and his family used to live on his father's meager monthly income of 1 million dong or approximately \$44 USD per month, and the limited financial support from his mother and his grandfather when he was still alive. With this income, it was impossible for the family to manage their lives and support Dinh with a six-year degree studying General Medicine. Given all of the difficulties that the family has faced, remarkably, Dinh is the first in his family to attend University.

Despite all of the challenges, Dinh has made every effort in his studies in order to realise his dream of becoming a skilled doctor. During a normal week he spends 5 hours on self-study and on the days leading to exams, he spends about 12 hours per day self-studying.

Besides his academic studies, Dinh is also a member of the Blood Donation Club of his university. Up to now, he has already carried out 26 platelet donations for those in need. Dinh shared with us, that he enjoys helping others, especially when it comes to saving a person's life.

Below is the beautiful letter of gratitude from Dinh to Lifestart Foundation. We hope you enjoy reading his letter of thanks.

Dinh's Thank-you Letter:

Dear Ms. Karen and Lifestart Foundation,

My name is Nguyen Trong Bao Dinh. I am now a third-year General Medicine student at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy. I was one of the students who was honored to receive a full scholarship from Lifestart Foundation.

Today I'm writing this letter to show my deep gratitude to Ms. Karen and Lifestart Foundation. When I heard that I had been chosen to be a recipient, I was so excited and happy. Most important of all I will achieve my dream that I have had since I was young – that I would come back to my hometown and dedicate my ability to my province, especially by helping poor people.

The scholarship that I received from Ms. Karen and Lifestart Foundation has helped me to reduce the financial problems in my family. With my scholarship, I will be able to support myself in studying at university. My parents will be able to concentrate on supporting my younger brother and sister and all the other expenses in my family. I was so surprised and



delighted when I was also given a new laptop, a necessary and meaningful gift for any student. From now, I can do my presentations, research documents, and prepare patients' files.

Tay Giang is a remote mountainous district in the westernmost part of Quang Nam Province. It is approximately 130 km from Hoi An and is among the poorest districts of the province, with the majority of people being Cotu ethnic people.

The Lifestart Foundation team including 4 staff and 4 volunteers visited the Dang commune of Tay Giang district and donated 110 food hampers including rice, cooking oil, fish sauce, soy sauce, washing powder, shampoo, toothpaste, and dish detergent to 110 ethnic minority families.

It took the team five and a half hours from an early morning start at 4am to arrive at 9.30 am. The trip by car involved crossing many zigzag mountain paths to get to the Dang commune which is located in a very isolated area. The Dang commune is one of the fifty-eight communes in Quang Nam that are included on the list of particularly difficult economically challenged communes. The team arrived back in Hoi An at 6.30pm. A long and tiring day but very rewarding at the same time.

Lifestart Foundation has committed a total of \$13,500 AUD (approx. 237,600,000 VND) worth of flood relief donations to hundreds of disadvantaged families across Quang Nam province. 

Unfortunately, the recent Covid-19 outbreak in Vietnam has left her mum unemployed so she has returned home to help Nhi's grandparents with the farming work.

To reduce some of the financial burdens on Nhi's mum's shoulders, Lifestart Foundation has supported them with a muchneeded hamper box donated by Ana. Nhi is pictured receiving many household essentials such as rice, cooking oil, soy sauce, fish sauce, dishwashing liquid, washing powder, shampoo, shower gel, and toothpaste. 



Luong is currently a 4th year General Medicine student at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy. She was born into a large family of seven, including her parents, her two elder sisters, her younger brother, her younger sister, and Luong. Unfortunately, her dad could not work after having a stroke which left him paralyzed on one side. Since then, her mum has taken over his role as the main breadwinner for her family. However, disaster came again when her mum's eye retina became detached and she lost her eyesight.

With the severe weather conditions in Central Vietnam, their house does not provide safe shelter for the family. Due to the old roof, it had water pouring in through gaping holes during the rainy season.

After the historic floods and typhoon hit Central Vietnam in 2020, it caused much damage to their house and the family members were put in dangerous living conditions. This has made their lives all the more difficult and it would be impossible for them to have their house repaired without support.

Much needed financial aid to help them repair their house was provided by Lifestart Foundation.

The donated funds have enabled them to replace their old flimsy roof with a more secure and new one. Images of the new roof are shown in this post.

REBUILDING AN ENTIRE VILLAGE IN TAY GIANG AFTER FLOODS, TYPHOON AND LANDSLIDES

A LONG TERM PROJECT COMPLETED!

UPDATE NUMBER 1 OF 8

Lifestart Foundation has visited and provided financial aid to build new houses for impoverished families impacted by floods, typhoons, and landslides in Tay Giang District, Quang Nam.

Over the past months, the Lifestart Foundation has partnered with the local government to provide VND 320 million in aid to re-locate and rebuild houses for 32 landslide-affected families in Tay Giang, who are all from the Cotu ethnic minority group. They live hand to mouth from their farming and they are desperately poor.

Each of these households received funding from Lifestart Foundation to complete their houses, designed in the typical traditional house style of the Cotu people.

Here is the background if you have missed our house-building project updates.

Tay Giang is remote and difficult to get to mountainous area over 150 kilometers from Hoi An.

Villages in Tay Giang were devastated by historic floods, typhoons, and landslides at the end of 2020.

Several weeks of torrential rain and the deadly typhoon Molave resulted in floods and subsequent landslides. More than 249 local people died and hundreds of thousands of homes collapsed and were completely destroyed. Many families had to permanently leave their homes and evacuate to a safer place. This devastation followed directly on top of the difficulties many families were experiencing with the impact of COVID 19.

One village in Tay Giang was so affected by the landslides that the entire village had to be completely relocated. The land where their houses previously stood was decimated and it was considered too dangerous to rebuild on the same land.

Lifestart Foundation raised a total of \$30,000 during our 30-day fundraising campaign to support the families affected by the deadly floods, landslides, and typhoons.


