She was orphaned when her mum passed away 10 years ago due to breast cancer. Currently, Trinh lives with her elderly grandmother who is nearly 90 years old, and her uncle and auntie. Trinh's uncle is blind but despite this, he mills rice to earn a living. Her auntie who has mental health problems is a rice farmer and she also raises pigs and sells duck eggs sometimes.

Trinh is a delightful and diligent student. Despite her disadvantaged background, Trinh has made every effort in her studies in order to help herself and her family escape the poverty cycle. She achieved a GPA of 3.63 out of a possible 4.0 in the second semester of year 3, achieving the title of excellent student. Trinh spends an average of 6 hours per day self-studying besides attending classes at university.

Recently Trinh participated in the city-level Japanese Eloquence Contest, which took place at Danang University of Foreign Language Studies. This contest is an opportunity for academic and cultural exchange, which aims at developing Japanese speaking skills for students, helping them to be confident and resilient toward future academic and career success.

Under the theme "Inspirational words that changed your life", Trinh and 9 other contestants competing in this competition have proved their outstanding language skills and presentation skills to the judges and also the audience. Her grandmother is very elderly and often gets sick. As a result, they are in a difficult living situation. To share the burden with her grandmother, Tam spends 1-2 hours a day helping her with household tasks such as cooking, cleaning the house, and washing the dishes.



Before receiving the Lifestart Foundation scholarship, Tam never had an opportunity to attend the all-important extra classes. Fortunately, since Tam received the Lifestart Foundation scholarship, her family life has improved. The scholarship granted to Tam has alleviated the financial burden on her grandmother's shoulders. MEET DIEU – FROM A DISADVANTAGED STUDENT TO A UNIVERSITY GRADUATE AND INTERN AT LIFESTART FOUNDATION

Dieu is currently a senior year student at Danang University of Foreign Language Studies and her major is English Translation and Interpreting. She has held a full Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship since year 10.

There are only two people in Dieu's family, her mother and herself. Dieu's mother is over 50 years old and she has been blind in one eye since birth which has always

made it very difficult for her to find a good job. She works as a rice farmer with a very modest and unstable income. Fortunately, Dieu's life has changed for the better since she was granted the precious Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship.

Dieu was a gifted language student and was already quite proficient in English during her high school years. She worked incredibly hard in order to gain acceptance to study at her preferred university. After studying diligently in year 12, Dieu was accepted to study English Interpreting and Translation at Danang University of Foreign Language Studies. The subsequent scholarship from Lifestart Foundation has carried Dieu through her tertiary education without having to worry about tuition fees and living expenses. Dieu is a student who has maintained excellent study results for many years. In addition to her tutorials at university, she spent 8 hours a day self-studying.

Recently, Dieu has worked at Lifestart Foundation as part of her final year internship experience. Her tasks included translation, promoting Education Scholarship students' stories to a wider range of audiences, and assisting in community projects and other administrative tasks. LIFESTART FOUNDATION UNIVERSITY GRADUATE - MEET GIANG FROM A DISADVANTAGED BACKGROUND TO BECOMING A DOCTOR

Congratulations Giang from all the team at Lifestart Foundation. We are so very proud of your accomplishments!

Lifestart Foundation Medical Scholarship student Giang has just graduated from Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy. He achieved his Degree in General Medicine – an outstanding achievement!

Unlike many other students, Giang took the university entrance exam twice. He shared the reason why he chose Medicine for his future career. "I lost two years living in torment about whether to follow my passion or not. Fortunately, a motorbike accident helped me understand

the meaning of a medical career and pushed me to make my decision."

Giang is the first in his family to graduate from university. He comes from a single-parent family. His parents divorced when he was studying in year 5 and since then he has been living with his mum and his grandparents.

Before Giang was awarded with the Lifestart Foundation Medical Scholarship, his mum worked as a housemaid with a very modest monthly income of 3.5 million vnd, which was approximately \$152 USD per month. With this income, it was impossible for the family to manage their lives and to support Giang with a six-year degree studying General Medicine.

Not discouraged by his disadvantaged situation and the many challenges in his life, Giang was a diligent, well-rounded student and always strove to do his best in his studies. He completed 30 hours of self-study per week during normal weeks and up to 70 hours per week on the days leading up to exams. Besides medical studies, he also worked hard on improving his English skills in order to read the all-important medical English materials as well as to study for the IELTS certificate, which is necessary for his future career. Giang also actively took part in meaningful extracurricular activities such as donating blood, and taking care of the homeless elderly people.

The full Lifestart Foundation Medical Scholarship covered all tuition, books, rent, and food costs, which relieved a lot of financial burden on his mum's shoulders. Giang was equipped with the best study conditions and he was also able to take some time off from working part-time in order to fully focus on his studies.

Giang is extremely grateful for the help from Lifestart Foundation. He shared - "On my studying path, I would not have been able to work hard up to the last moment without the support of my family, my friends and especially the Lifestart Foundation Team. This study result is not only a reflection of my own efforts, but also is thanks to the great support from Lifestart Foundation."

My is one of our recent Education Scholarship students to graduate from university. She has completed a 4-year Bachelor's degree in Law at University of Law in Ho Chi Minh City. My achieved a GPA of 3.56 out of a possible 4.0 in the final semester at University. We are so very proud of her accomplishment and the young woman she has grown into.

My received a Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship in year 6, and she is the first in her family to graduate from university.

My comes from a family of four, including her dad, mum, and younger sister. Her dad is a builder's assistant and her mum is a farmer. They grow rice and raise some chickens to help cover their basic living costs.

The Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship awarded to My when she was twelve years of age was a major turning point for her family. Each year the Lifestart Foundation scholarship paid for her tuition fees, the all-important additional



extra classes, uniforms, shoes, and books. This took a huge financial weight off the shoulders of her family and she was also provided with the best possible learning conditions.

My has always been a dedicated student and in Year 10 was accepted into Le Thanh Tong High school for gifted students.

After successfully completing Year 12 this year, she applied for her dream course in Ho Chi Minh City to study Law.

She usually spent 4-7 hours a day on self-study and up to 14 hours a day when time allowed. Thuy Linh is currently a senior General Medicine student at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy. She is another successful applicant who has received a Lifestart Foundation Medical Scholarship. Linh is the first in her family to attend University.

As with all Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship students, Linh has a difficult family situation, which she explains in her letter of gratitude below.

Linh's family's monthly income is only 5,000,000 VND or approximately \$217 USD per month, which makes it extremely difficult for her parents to manage their daily living expenses while having to support her with six years of university studies. As a result, they

had to borrow a large sum of money so she could continue her education.

Despite her disadvantaged situation and many challenges in his life, Linh has made every effort in her study. Her results at the end of the second semester of Year 5 were very good and she received a study average of 3.71 out of a possible 4. Every week Linh usually spends a total of 45 hours on self-study. On the days leading up to her exams, she completes a total of 55 hours per week of self-studying.

After receiving her Lifetstart Foundation Scholarship Thuy Linh's life has changed for the better. Thanks to the timely support from Lifestart Foundation, she no longer had to worry about tuition fees and living expenses. Linh was also able to take time off from working part-time as a tutor, which has helped her focus completely on her studies to achieve her desired goals. Linh shared that "Without this prestigious scholarship, I certainly couldn't perform well in my studies because I cannot afford reference books as well as I would not be able to attend English courses which are necessary for my studies."

At present, Linh is interested in Ophthalmology. We believe that with the full support from Lifestart Foundation and her family, she will be even more inspired to reach new heights.



THUY LINH'S THANK-YOU LETTER:

Dear Karen and every one at Lifestart Foundation,

My name is Doan Thi Thuy Linh, one of the lucky students who has been granted a prestigious scholarship. Currently I'm a student at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy, majoring in General Medicine.

Today I'm writing this letter to express my sincere gratitude to you and everyone at Lifestart Foundation for giving me the chance to receive this valuable scholarship. Your support is a huge motivation for me to strive harder in the future.

This past year has been a really challenging one when the Covid-19 pandemic has impacted each and every one of us the world over. I wish you all good health and hope you stay healthy to overcome these tough times.

To begin with, I'd like to share with you my family situation. I was born and raised in Binh Son, a poor commune in the mountainous district Hiep Duc of Quang Nam province. There are 5 people in my family, including my grandmother, my parents, my older brother and myself. My hometown is in a farming area, and as with many households in the village, both my parents are farmers. My father has been the main laborer in the family. Although he has suffered for a long time from spinal pain due to hard work my family does not have the financial resources for treatment, so his condition does not improve but gets worse. My mother's health is also not good. Everything was going as normal in our lives until one day at the end of April 2019. During the process of clearing the forest, my father suffered a work accident when a piece of a tree hit his left eye and as a result, he almost lost his vision. From being the breadwinner in the family, my father became a patient. Because of his injury, he had to limit his activities, so he could not continue to do his job. Recently, my father had eye surgery, but due to the serious injury in 2019, the vision in his left eye only partially recovered and he was not able to return to his normal life.

My mother has also suffered from osteoarthritis for many years. We have been going to many places to seek and try different types of medicine and remedies of both Eastern and Western approaches, but this disease is still not cured. Having said that, my mum still works very hard to support our family without any complaints. My elder brother is currently working in Hoa Khanh Industrial Zone in Da Nang. His income from working there helps cover his own living expenses with some left over for my mother's medical fees.

I am very lucky to have been introduced to Lifestart Foundation scholarships for medical students by my university. When I was informed that I had passed the application round and had been chosen for the interview in Hoi An, I was really excited and looking forward to a successful result. At the beginning of the interview, I was a bit nervous. However, thanks to the encouragement from Karen and Nhung, I was reassured and felt more confident. After the interview, I was not sure if I had been successful, on the other hand, I still hoped that I would be one of the lucky students to receive this scholarship. When I found out that I had been selected, I was overjoyed and burst into happy tears! The scholarship means a lot to me and my family. Your gift not only represents material help to me, but also gives me great encouragement to overcome all my difficulties. The amount of the scholarship will help cover my tuition fees and other living expenses. An enormous burden has been lifted from my parents' shoulders, as they won't have to worry too much about borrowing money for my tuition fees anymore. I will have a chance to buy more reference books, which is really beneficial for my studies. It is also a huge motivation for me to constantly strive harder to be well-prepared for my future.

I would like to express my sincere gratitude to you and everyone at Lifestart Foundation for giving me the opportunity to receive this valuable scholarship. THE DETERMINATION TO OVERCOME ADVERSITY TO REALIZE A LONG-HELD
DREAM

Thanh received a Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship in Year 7. He has recently passed the National High school Graduation Exam and has commenced his first year studying General Medicine at Danang University of Medical Technology and Pharmacy. Thanh is the first in his family to attend University.

Thanh will join the current group of 6 outstanding Lifestart Foundation General Medicine students at Danang University of Medical Technology and Pharmacy.

Like all of our Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship students, Thanh was born into a very poor family.

Thanh was born and raised in a family of four, including his parents and his little sister who is in grade 3. In the past, his father who worked as a builder's assistant in Danang used to be the only income earner for the family. Very sadly, he passed away 2 years ago due to liver cancer, leaving his mother widowed with two children to raise alone. Since then, all of the family responsibilities have fallen on Thanh's mother's shoulders, if things weren't difficult enough, his mum has heart problems and cannot do strenuous work. She is now the sole breadwinner of the family and despite her poor health, she works as a shop assistant to earn an income to support her family.

What they can do is to grow veggies and raise some chickens for the family.

Despite her family's financial struggles, Nhi is a diligent student and always tries her best in her studies. Thanks to the full Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship Nhi received in year 7 that has lightened her family's financial burden, Nhi has been able to fully focus on her studies and is one step closer to reaching her education and career goals. In addition to attending classes at school and the all-important extra classes, she dedicates an average of 5-6 hours per day to self-study. She achieved a GPA of 8.3 out of a possible 10 in year 11.

Nhi has demonstrated talent in Biology since she first studied this subject in year 6. In this school year, Nhi was one of the 5 students who represented their school at the provincial level Contest for Excellent Students in Biology where Nhi successfully won the 3rd prize, a testament to her dedication and hard work.

With a passion for Medicine, Nhi aspires to become a doctor and help disadvantaged people in the future. Biology is one of the three mandatory subjects for Medical university entrance exams, and Nhi is eager to study the subject in more depth. She is determined to continue working hard to achieve her dream of breaking the cycle of poverty for her family and becoming a good doctor who will help disadvantaged people.

Sam comes from a large family of six people, including her parents, her elder sister, her 2 younger sisters, and herself. Both her father and mother are rice farmers who work very hard to support the entire family with their modest income. Sometimes her dad also works as a builder's assistant and her mother assists at weddings to earn a little more income to make ends meet. To share the burden with her parents, Sam also helps them with household chores including cooking, washing dishes, and sweeping the house whenever she has free time.

Despite her disadvantaged family situation, Sam is a diligent student and always shows her excellent academic achievements throughout her education path. Every day Sam spends an average of 5.5-6 hours on self-study in addition



to attending classes at school and extra courses. As a result of her diligence, she achieved a GPA of 8.7 out of a possible 10 in the first semester of Year 12, which ranked her second in her class. At this stage, Sam would like to become an English teacher so she is striving hard every day in order to realize her dream.

Sam is pictured receiving milk as additional monthly support from her sponsor. We hope that this kind of support will give her more nutrition and create the best learning conditions for her.

Unfortunately, her father passed away a few years ago due to an accident, leaving her mother widowed with 4 young children to raise alone. The family lives on her meagre income of only 4,000,000

VND per month or approximately \$174 USD per month from making shoes.

Despite her difficult background, Quynh has always tried her utmost in her studies in order to help her family break the poverty cycle. Every day she spends about 5 to 6 hours reviewing the previous lessons, preparing for the next ones, and practicing more advanced exercises. Her GPA in year 8 was 9.1 out of a possible 10.

To reduce some of the financial burdens on Quynh's mother's shoulders, Lifestart Foundation has supported them with a much-needed hamper box donated by her sponsor.
