DUONG'S GRATITUDE LETTER

Dear Ms. Karen and Lifestart Foundation,

My name is Lam Thi Duong, a fourth-year medical student majoring in General Medicine at Danang University of Medical Technology and Pharmacy.

Firstly, I would like to extend my best wishes to you for your good health and express my sincere gratitude to the sponsors, Ms. Karen, and Lifestart Foundation, for your care and support and for providing me with the opportunity to receive this valuable scholarship.

I was born and raised in a poor farming family of 5, including my mother, my brother, sister, and me. When my mother was young, she used to carry fruit baskets and travel everywhere selling goods so that she could support our family, taking care of my 2 siblings and me. As my mother grew older, she began to show signs of joint degeneration, lumbar spine tightening, rheumatoid arthritis, and osteoporosis. Despite seeking medical



treatment, the bone and joint pain still afflicted my mother continually, adding a financial burden that weighed heavily on my father's shoulders.

Life is inherently difficult, but it seems to be even more cruel to my family. At the beginning of 2022, my father suddenly had a stroke, leaving him paralyzed on the right side and unable to speak or take care of himself. He requires assistance for everything, from eating to personal hygiene. Since the day my father fell ill, my mother has been unable to continue working as a farmer due to joint pain. As a result, our fields, which were our only source of income, have been abandoned. Now, we rely solely on my older siblings for financial support, but they already have their own families. Their lives are very difficult and they are now struggling. My older brother lost his job at his last company because he spent time taking care of our father during his three-month hospitalization. My older sister works in a factory in Da Nang, has an unstable income, and lives in a rented room. Her salary is barely enough to support her own family. As the youngest child in the family, I am still studying and unable to help my parents. Instead, I am a burden on them when it comes to food, living expenses, and educational costs.

Because I didn't want my siblings to have to worry about taking care of our parents and me, I always tried to make use of my free time to work and earn money to support myself. The part-time jobs I had included room cleaning, serving, assisting in a kitchen, washing dishes, and more, from 5 p.m. to 10 p.m. However, despite the difficulties, I never thought of quitting my studies. I always strived to balance my time between studying and working. However, those casual jobs only provided enough money for daily expenses, and the cost of education is a big issue that I couldn't find a solution to. Every time my mother mentioned my tuition fees, my father cried. I know he is sad because of his illness, and even sadder because there was no one else to support me in my education. At that time, I also cried a lot because I felt like my dreams had come to an end. But looking back at the arduous journey of preparing for the university entrance exams and having already completed half of the university journey, I couldn't stop. So, in order to continue my education, I discussed things with my siblings and decided to take out a student loan from the government bank. Every month, I have to manage my own expenses to repay the interest to the bank. Life is truly difficult for me, but I tried to be mature and stay strong. Even though I couldn't be a shoulder for my mother to lean on, I always reminded myself to be strong so that she can have peace of mind.

The recent interview at LSF was an incredibly valuable opportunity for me to continue with my dreams. When I received the information about the interview date, I prepared a great deal, but I still felt a little nervous when I entered the interview room. However, I received a lot of care and attention from Ms. Karen and the staff at the Lifestart Foundation, which made me feel the warmth of everyone here. After the interview, I felt truly touched because it was the first time I had experienced the warm affection of people around me, allowing me to share all the difficulties that my family and I have faced. I thought that regardless of the outcome, I had tried my best at the interview, and I was fortunate to have attended it.

When my university decided to double the tuition fees this year I was very worried about my future, so I was truly overwhelmed when I received the news that I had been awarded a scholarship from the Lifestart Foundation. It seemed like the happiest day in my life after the difficult years of my twenties, and I immediately called my mother to share the news. She couldn't hold back her tears. This scholarship means more to me than just significant financial support; it is a source of spiritual comfort that will help me overcome the difficulties in my life; it is a warm flame that ignites my dreams. For my family, this is truly a great joy after countless hardships. My parents can now be assured about my future, and my siblings can fully focus on taking care of our parents and their own small families. The burden of tuition and living expenses is no longer a worry, causing sleepless nights for my parents. With this scholarship, I will have more time for studying and less financial pressure regarding my daily living expenses. I will be able to participate in English classes to improve my skills in the language. I aim to take the TOEIC exam to meet the graduation requirement of my university. The sponsorship is the motivation for me to continue striving and working harder to ensure good results in the coming years and be deserving of this prestigious scholarship.

Currently, I am in the first semester of my fourth year. I have daily hospital internships in the morning along with theoretical classes in the afternoons, and 1-2 night shifts at the hospital every week. The amount of knowledge I need to learn is extensive, and time is relatively limited as most of it is dedicated to the internship. I usually take advantage of the time after the morning internship to rush to university to study, then I rest a bit before attending classes in the afternoon. Therefore, I still maintain a daily study time of 6-8 hours. In the first semester, I will be interning at the hospital for 3 months. After completing the internship, I will have a relatively free amount of time, so I want to use it to join an English class and along with my self-studying, I hope to



improve my proficiency in the language. I will also participate in extracurricular activities and community volunteering organized by clubs at the university.

After graduation, if given the opportunity, I would like to prepare for the residency entrance examination to specialize in Obstetrics and Gynecology in order to enhance my clinical skills. After that, I want to return to my hometown to develop my career and help impoverished individuals who still have access to only limited healthcare.

Sometimes, when I look at my friends who have parents taking care of everything from food to education for them, I feel a bit disheartened. But that doesn't mean I give up. I strive every day for my own dreams. I only think that, compared to them, I face some difficulties and my path is a bit rocky. My parents are my motivation, the people who inspire me the most whenever I feel stuck or desperate. When I think of them, I immediately let go of my worries and focus all my energy on my studies, trying my best every second, every minute, in the hope that soon I will be able to take care of them. Despite my family circumstances and facing financial difficulties, I remain persistent and set myself high goals to acquire knowledge and develop myself. By demonstrating patience and effort in overcoming challenges and barriers in my educational journey, I have seized every learning opportunity and actively participated in extracurricular activities to expand my knowledge and skills. This has been recognized by my teachers and highly appreciated by my instructors. My friends have also entrusted me with the responsibility of being a leader in group studies. I believe in my abilities and my potential to thrive and achieve success in the future. Now that I have received a scholarship from you, I will be able to continue my education and further develop myself to pursue my passion to the fullest.

I would like to express my sincere gratitude to Ms. Karen and the Lifestart Foundation for giving me this valuable opportunity. financial support lifted a huge burden from her family, allowing Tuyet to fully concentrate on her studies. After years of hard work, she proudly graduated with a distinction Bachelor degree in Rehabilitation Engineering from the Danang University of Medical Technology and Pharmacy. She is now an intern at Danang C Hospital.

TUYET'S GRATITUDE LETTER

Dear everyone at Lifestart Foundation,

My name is Tang Thi Tuyet, a recently graduated student from the Rehabilitation Engineering major at Danang University of Medical Technology and Pharmacy.

Last semester, I had to complete my Clinical practice for my graduation at the Rehabilitation Hospital in Da Nang, and I also worked on my thesis. This clinical internship was different from previous ones because the evaluation was done by the hospital. I interned here for 6 weeks, not only with adult patients but also with pediatric patients. I had the opportunity to encounter a wider range of diseases and gain more experience.

With the guidance of my advisor, I completed the thesis to the best of my abilities. Both modules of this semester earned me an A mark, and my overall GPA for this semester is 4.0/4.0. This is a score I never thought I would achieve and it surpasses the goal I had set in the previous semester and I am graduating with honors. This is something I have always aspired to, and the change in my gaining marks since the third year has brought me closer to the degree I desired. I am very happy and satisfied with this achievement. It paid off my own efforts, the support of my family, you and Lifestart Foundation, and my friends. And importantly, thanks to the guidance of Lifestart Foundation, I have made progress in my studies.

This June has been the happiest month I have ever had because in this month, I graduated and went to Hanoi to participate in the 2nd Vietnam Physiotherapy Association Scientific Conference. My thesis advisor encouraged me to make a presentation at this conference. At first, I was worried that I wouldn't do well, but I also wanted to experience presenting outside. So I registered to participate, and under the guidance of my advisor, I was invited to attend. Attending this conference allowed me to learn many things, which helped broaden my perspective on the field of physiotherapy. It was an amazing experience, and I received a certificate and a commemorative plaque for presenting at the conference. At that moment, I felt truly happy because it marked a milestone in the field I have been studying.

I have applied for an internship at Danang C Hospital. I chose this place for my internship because the working environment between technicians and patients is really good. I have previously completed an internship at this hospital, so I really enjoy working here. My major, Functional Rehabilitation, allows me to work with both pediatric and adult patients, but I plan to focus on adult physical therapy and also learn about Occupational Therapy. I'm passionate about this subject, and it is also in high demand in Da Nang.

Time has flown very quickly since I first received a Lifestart Foundation scholarship in year 7 and now I have graduated. Before I was awarded the scholarship from the Lifestart Foundation, my family faced many difficulties; my father had been ill for many years, and as a result, he couldn't work fixed-hours and could only do part-time farming work, avoiding direct sunlight. Both my parents worked as farmers, and our home income depended on the crops we grew. Our household included my grandmother and younger brother, and everyone relied heavily on my parents. I understood the difficulties my family faced, and I was determined to study hard. I always believed that good academic performance would bring opportunities for me.

I still remember when I was in year 7, Lifestart Foundation came to my school to support students from disadvantaged backgrounds with good academic achievements. I had an interview with my father, and the charitable organization also visited my home. The second interview took place in Hoi An, where I had a conversation with Ms. Karen. I was really nervous, but thanks to the friendliness and gentleness of everyone, I felt more comfortable and shared openly. When I received the news that I had been granted a scholarship I was extremely happy, but I didn't show it because there were many people around. Perhaps my father was the happiest person at that moment because he had been with me throughout. He also heard congratulations from Ms. Karen herself, which brought joy to our family.



During this time, the Lifestart Foundation scholarship has had a tremendously positive impact on my family, as it has helped both me and my family to live more stable lives. I have received comprehensive support, including tuition fees, books, school uniform, and shoes. When I was in year 7, I received a brand-new bicycle to replace my old one, which I used until year 10 to travel the long distance between home and school. Then Lifestart Foundation gave me an electric bicycle. These bicycles were not only used by me but are still being used by my younger brother to go to school now. The financial burden of my education on my parents was significantly reduced, and they were able to provide better conditions for my younger brother.

Throughout my time at university, the Lifestart Foundation has provided financial support for my studies, and when storms and floods affected our family, Lifestart Foundation visited and supported us again. During the Covid-19 pandemic and the difficult economic situation, the provision of essential items for my family from the Lifestart Foundation helped us overcome that period too. That was the most challenging time of my childhood; however, thanks to the dedicated support from the foundation, we were able to get through. Our family is tremendously grateful for the unwavering support of the Lifestart Foundation.

I am very appreciative of your support for me on this journey. I would like to express my deep gratitude to Ms Karen who created opportunities for me to have fun and interact with others. I also would like to thank the staff at Lifestart Foundation for their wholehearted support. Being helped by you and everyone at Lifestart Foundation is perhaps the luckiest thing that has happened to me. I will always cherish everything you have done for me and my family. It is thanks to your love, and your assistance that I have become who I am today. I promise to strive hard to contribute my value to society. Dear everyone at Lifestart Foundation,

My name is Phan Thi Bao Vy, I am majoring in General Medicine at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy. Today, I am writing this letter to express my profound gratitude to you for generously granting me this precious Lifestart Foundation scholarship.

I was born and raised in a poor family in Thua Thien Hue province. My family includes five members: my parents, my younger sister and brother and myself. My family's income depends on the meagre amount of money my parents earn: my father makes a living by repairing bicycles and doing saltwater aquaculture, while my mother runs a small grocery store from home. My parents' jobs have unstable incomes. In particular, when things go well, my father's small shrimp and fish pond provides some income, but when the weather is unfavourable or there are issues with the offspring, it can run at a complete loss. Despite the difficult life in many aspects, my parents are determined to support my two siblings and me to pursue our education, hoping that we will be able to escape from poverty, get jobs and have a better life than theirs. My parents often say that "only via education can we escape poverty, my children!" Completely understanding their desires and the importance of education for my future, I have always been serious in my studies and paid special attention to them. I always strive to study diligently and achieve good results and certificates, bringing peace of mind and pride to my parents.

However, as I progressed to my higher school year, the burden of our education expenses became too much for my parents. In fact, they had delayed the construction of our house, which is considered a foundation for settling down, and our family continued living in the cramped bungalow that my grandfather lent us. This ensured that they could afford the living expenses and education for me and my siblings, without a need to borrow money from everyone which would put them in a difficult position. The small joy of my parents was when we brought home awards, certificates of achievement or sometimes when I proudly announced that I



got high marks. In those moments, my parents' eyes were always filled with pride. Perhaps due to struggling with multiple strenuous jobs, my parents' health has been greatly affected. Joint and spine pain mercilessly affects them whenever the weather changes. However, they endure the pain and keep working without treatment as this would result in additional expenses. It is partly because of these experiences that a dream of becoming a doctor was ignited in me, with the aim of taking care of my parents and loved ones and helping those in need in my hometown. Life, which has been full of challenges, became even more overwhelming when, at the end of year 12, my mother was diagnosed with aggressive breast cancer. The word "cancer" was so unfamiliar and terrifying to my family. Thanks to the efforts of the doctors and their treatment of her, things eventually stabilised, but her health will never be the same as before. Currently, her health is still being monitored and she is bravely fighting against her illness because the cancer can spread at any time.

Previously, in order to help my parents, I used to take part-time jobs such as working at wedding venues and as a tutor, but the salary was never enough. When the schedule of studying and working became increasingly overwhelming, I could not continue with my job. Then, when my younger brother informed us that he had been accepted into university and my youngest sibling was about to enter Year 1, a sense of pride remained but I felt the weight of the immense financial burden heavily pressing down on my parents' shoulders. Furthermore, I learned that the next academic year, my university would implement self-funding which would double the current tuition fees. This filled me with confusion: "Where will the money come from to pay for the tuition fees" was the question arising in my mind at that time. 'How can I pursue my dream of studying General Medicine to escape poverty and help my family and the community'? I know that I am still much more fortunate than other underprivileged people in society, but I truly need help from kind-hearted individuals to make my path towards my dream smoother and to relieve some of the hardships my parents endure.

Then, one day, I received an email that the Lifestart Foundation was inviting applications from scholarship candidates, illuminating a ray of hope within me. Fortunately, my application was approved, and I was asked to participate in an interview. Initially, I was so nervous, but thanks to the warm assistance from the staff, I then felt much more comfortable. As for me, it was not an interview, but rather a conversation between me, Ms. Karen and the staff where I had an opportunity to share about my life and my long-held aspirations. One week after the interview, I received a phone call from Ms. Nhung informing me that I had been granted a scholarship which filled me with immense joy. I immediately called home and my parents were deeply emotional, repeatedly asking me to say thank you and to always study hard so as not to disappoint your expectations in me.

The Lifestart Foundation scholarship has a profound meaning for me and my family, serving as a tremendous source of motivation, both spiritually and materially, and strengthening me to overcome obstacles to fulfil my dreams. It also provides me with the means to pay for tuition fees, purchase textbooks and essential study equipment, and cover my monthly living expenses. With this support, the burden on my parents' shoulders has been reduced and they do not need to strain themselves excessively and compromise their health. Thanks to the scholarship, I can concentrate completely on studying, and my parents can fully focus on taking care of our family and my two younger siblings. This year the subjects have become more and more specialised and challenging. Therefore, I think I need to pay more attention to my goals and wisely arrange my study time to ensure both good academic results and my own well-being. In addition to self-study, I am actively improving my English skills as I am aware of the importance of this language nowadays. After graduation, if possible, I will pursue further studies and move to the South for work. My future goal is to become a well-qualified doctor who possesses both competence and compassion, and to provide care to many people especially those in difficult circumstances.

I am truly fortunate and grateful that I was selected to receive this meaningful scholarship. I promise that your support will be used in a responsible and meaningful way. Life is full of struggles but the flame of knowledge inside me will never be extinguished, and I believe that with the help of the scholarship, my study journey and personal development will continue to improve and advance. I promise to study hard, actively improve myself and enhance needed skills for the future. I pledge never to give up and always try to be worthy of the compassionate and loving care you have bestowed upon me. Finally, I wish all of you and the Lifestart Foundation robust health and hope that the two organisations will continue to thrive and achieve resounding success. Once again, thank you very much.

DOCTOR OF THE FUTURE - INTRODUCING DIEU

Recently, Lifestart Foundation has awarded a new round of major Medical scholarships to 18 students at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy and Danang University of Medical Technology and Pharmacy. These scholarships were awarded to super impressive students who have demonstrated academic excellence and are from extremely disadvantaged backgrounds. By way of their chosen vocation, they

also meet our criteria of completing a degree in an area that will not only benefit themselves and their families in the future but more importantly the wider community.

Lifestart Foundation is delighted to welcome one of our new scholarship recipients - Dieu, a General Medicine student at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy. With impressive outstanding grades and stories of the



hardships his family has endured, we couldn't help but shed tears for Dieu - a poor student who has overcome adversity and excelled academically.

Dieu's childhood was filled with misfortune as he was born and raised in an extremely impoverished family in the dense forests of Nghi Loc district, where living conditions were incredibly challenging due to scarce resources. Dieu comes from a family of six, he is the eldest brother and the first to attend university. Due to their difficult circumstances, Dieu's parents had to work far from home, and at a young age, he had to learn to become self-sufficient, taking on the role of both a father and a mother to care for his younger siblings. With his parents absent and lacking many necessities, the lives of Dieu and his three siblings were devoid of sufficient food. They crushed cassava into flour to make steamed cakes, which became the main dish for the entire family because they could not afford rice to eat, and they would buy a few fish from the market to cook a salty dish to eat for the entire week.

Dieu usually went to the forest to collect medicinal plants to sell to earn extra money for their daily meals. The strain of working hard to provide for the children's education took a toll on the health of Dieu's parents, with his mother weighing a mere 39 kg despite being 1.50m tall. The already difficult life made Dieu increasingly resilient and determined in his studies. He aspires for his education to improve his life and help his family overcome the adversity of poverty.

During his years in school, Dieu consistently achieved the title of an excellent student with admirable and outstanding grades. His efforts and dedication became even more evident when he gained admission to Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy and continued to achieve excellent academic results during his early years at University. To achieve these outstanding results, Dieu dedicated 5-6 hours of self-study every day outside of regular university hours, increasing his study time to 14-16 hours on exam days. His results at the end of second year were at 3.58 out of a possible 4.

Dieu shared with us that no one in this world is like anyone else, and every individual deserves to be respected and admired. From each individual, he can learn many things, and by combining those learnings, he can develop his own personal philosophy of life. With his spirit of curiosity, in addition to the goal of achieving high grades in academics, Dieu also wants to further improve his English skills to serve his studies and the profession he is pursuing.

DIEU'S GRATITUDE LETTER

Dear Ms. Karen, and Lifestart Foundation,

My name is Le Van Dieu, a third-year medical student majoring in general medicine at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy. Today, I am writing this letter to express my utmost gratitude to you, Ms Karen and Lifestart Foundation for choosing me to be a scholarship recipient of Lifestart Foundation.

I would also like to share a few things about my family and circumstances, as well as what I have been through over the last few years, so that you can get to know more about me. My family consists of six members, and we come from a tradition of farming, growing up in a poor rural area. It is a barren land with limited resources where the saying goes "Dogs eat rocks, chickens eat pebbles" and our life presents many challenges. With just over 3 acres of cultivated land, we can only grow enough rice and crops for our own consumption, leaving us worried about various expenses. As a result, my mother had to move to Hanoi to find a job. Due to her health issues, she had to change jobs many times, and she could only handle light manual labor tasks that provided very little income. Meanwhile, my father stays at home to work on the farm and facilitate our education, taking on various additional jobs whenever people hire him. Among the four siblings, I am currently the first one enrolled in university. Next to me is my younger brother, who, three years ago when he was in year 9, contracted a corneal ulcer. He was taken for treatment to Vinh, Hanoi, and Ho Chi Minh City, but all in



vain, the treatment was unsuccessful, and he has now lost the sight in one eye. The two-year-long treatment interrupted his studies, and because his eye still frequently hurts, he had to drop out of school. The exorbitant medical expenses have added a further burden to our family.

Recently, after months of unsuccessful job hunting due to his weak eyesight, he managed to find a low-paying builder's assistant job. When he was accepted to do that job, he called me and said, "Now that I have a job, and I will earn money to support you in your education." Hearing this, I couldn't hold back my tears. Besides my younger brother, I also have two younger sisters, one is in secondary school and the other is in primary school. Therefore, the cost of living and education is always a constant worry for my family.

When I was young, both my parents had to work far away from home, so I had to learn to be independent and take on the role of parent to my younger siblings, taking care of them and guiding them in their studies. Because of this, I always knew that I had to put in a lot of effort in both my studies and other responsibilities. I also realized that education was the only path that could help me and my family escape from this difficult situation. I was self-motivated to seek information for my study and expand my knowledge, even though I did not attend any extra classes.

When I transitioned from secondary school to high school, I abandoned the idea of taking the entrance exam for gifted student schools because I knew that my family was facing economic hardships at that time. Not entering a school for gifted students didn't discourage me; instead, I tried even harder and achieved high prizes in the provincial excellent student competition in Chemistry. However, when it came to deciding to take the university entrance exams, I realized that I needed to pursue my own dreams and also the dreams of my family. I wanted to turn this dream into reality so that after graduation, I could have a stable job and become a skilled doctor, helping and saving many patients and supporting my parents in taking care of my siblings.

After more than two years of studying in the new university environment, starting from my solo journey to Hue, going to different places to find accommodation, and then carefully purchasing every item for my room to save as much money as possible, I also found a job tutoring a year 5 boy. I have taught him for two years during Years 5 and 6 with three sessions per week at an income of 800,000 Vietnamese Dong per month. It was a bit busy and time-consuming, but I felt very happy doing this job. I also joined a volunteer club, participating in activities to guide disabled children in their studies and assisting the elderly in nursing homes. Furthermore, every summer I participated in free medical check-ups and medication distribution with fellow doctors in my hometown. Now, in my third year, due to the hectic schedule of my studies, I haven't been able to find sufficient time to continue my tutoring work.

Last September, after submitting Lifestart Foundation scholarship application documents based on the information provided by the university, I was fortunate to be among the selected students to go to Hoi An for an interview. Initially, I felt very worried and anxious. But thanks to the care and encouragement from everyone at Lifestart Foundation, especially Ms. Karen and Ms. Nhung, they helped and made me feel comfortable while answering questions and sharing stories from my life.

After the interview session ended, my worries gradually faded away and my expectation for the announcement of the results grew stronger day by day. When I received the news that I had been chosen to receive this scholarship, I was truly overjoyed, jumping with happiness and excitement. It was news that I had been eagerly waiting for every day. Immediately, I called to share this with my parents and grandparents. Everyone in my family was momentarily speechless, unable to believe that I had received such a valuable scholarship. Then, everyone became extremely happy and sent words of encouragement to me, telling me to study even harder to be worthy of what I was about to receive. Certainly, I deeply appreciate this moment and silently promised to put in even more effort.

With this scholarship, my family will no longer have to worry about my tuition fees. The money that my parents have saved can be allocated to more important matters. It makes my life and my family's life easier, reducing some of the financial burdens on my family, especially as the university has decided to increase tuition fees. The scholarship also allows me to focus on my studies and achieve the desired results.

Additionally, I can also use the scholarship to help with my living expenses and meals. Honestly, if I had not received this scholarship, I don't know how difficult my life and studies would be. Having received your scholarship, I understand that I have a responsibility to boost the value of it beyond its material worth via my



efforts and personal growth, with the aim of giving back to many others, especially to the patients I will encounter in the future.

Currently, the study in third year has become more intense. Aside from the theoretical studies at the university, I will soon begin clinical subjects at the hospital, and I have also started studying English at Hue University of Foreign Languages and International Studies. Therefore, I will have to allocate more time for self-study. In addition to the two daily study sessions at university, I will dedicate around 5-6 hours each evening for self-review. During the exams at the end of each semester, I will allocate 14-16 hours per day for studying. I will try to manage my time wisely, leaving some time for rest, cooking, and calling my family. I will also set aside 30 minutes to 1 hour every day to study English on my own.

My goal is to take the IELTS certification exam to facilitate my future career and various plans. If possible, I also want to pursue further education after completing my six-years at university, in order to enhance my professional skills and create more job opportunities for myself after graduation. I am also considering searching for scholarships to study abroad. However, everything requires time to think through carefully before making a decision.

Finally, I would like to express my sincere gratitude to Ms. Karen, and the Lifestart Foundation for generously awarding me this scholarship which is a motivation for me to strive harder in my studies, achieve high results, and further develop various aspects of myself. Thank you to everyone who has shown love, care, and support for me throughout the scholarship application process as well as the journey ahead.

This scholarship will be an important milestone in my life. I will always cherish it and hope that in the future, I will continue to make more progress to be deserving of this great gift.

THAO'S GRATITUDE LETTER:

Dear Ms. Karen and everyone at Lifestart Foundation,

I am Pham Ngoc Thu Thao, a student of the Lifestart Foundation and for many years, a recipient of the Lifestart Foundation scholarship. I have just graduated with a Bachelor's degree in English Language from the University of Social Sciences and Humanities, Vietnam National University, Ho Chi Minh City (VNU HCMC). Today, as I look back on my journey, I would like to express my deepest gratitude to everyone who has accompanied me on my educational path.

After a long journey of effort, I have recently graduated with a cumulative GPA of 8.04 out of a possible 10, achieving a Distinction degree that I set out to achieve before entering university.

Remembering back to when I first moved to Ho Chi Minh City away from close relatives, I decided to stay in the VNU HCMC Dormitory during my first year. Although the dormitory had many inconveniences, looking back it provided an excellent environment for me to develop self-discipline and learn to live independently. After the first semester, I made many friends in the dormitory, and they have been my companions ever since.

During my university years, I worked part-time as an English teacher. After graduating, I realized my desire to work in the field of education and continue to impart knowledge to students. Therefore, I decided to apply for a formal position at the European Language Center branch in Di An city and currently work as an Academic Officer and Teacher. Additionally, I teach classes at the Lai Thieu branch in Thuan An city. I frequently commute between these two cities to ensure I meet my work responsibilities. Meeting new colleagues and students in different contexts has motivated me greatly to continue my journey. Apart from teaching at branch locations and affiliated schools, I also handle classroom operations and monitor student enrollments at the branches. Recognizing my lack of experience in teaching experience, I spend a significant amount of time in the office reading textbooks and current materials, while also participating in online courses on classroom management skills. Currently, I am taking online courses on teaching skills and plan to pursue certifications such as TESOL, CELTA, TKT, or possibly a Master's degree depending on job requirements in the future.

Looking back at my secondary school years, I never dared to dream of attending university in a modern and distant city like Ho Chi Minh City. At that time, it was purely a dream for me, though something that could help my family and me have a better life. However, I didn't know how to achieve that dream. During that period, my mother was the main breadwinner for the family, working as a lantern maker in a small local workshop. I remember that during those years, my mother often left early and came back late earning money for the family but with a salary of only about three million dong each month. My younger brother and I were both schoolaged, so the family's expenses were barely covered, and my brother and I had to share all our school supplies. Our family lived with my grandmother, who helped with meals whenever possible. As I grew older and reflected on the time before I received the educational scholarship from Lifestart Foundation, I truly didn't know how my family managed to keep me from dropping out of school. Given the economic situation at that time, although I really wanted to study at a specialized high school, I had to convince myself that a regular high school would be fine as long as I worked hard. My family and I only hoped that I could finish high school, but the path to university seemed out of reach.



Then, in 7th grade, I received an educational scholarship from the Lifestart Foundation. At that time, I believed that scholarships were only for students with outstanding academic achievements, and I wasn't so confident in myself at that time. The teacher in charge and my homeroom teacher encouraged me to apply to find a brighter path for my future, so I gathered all my courage and submitted my application. I had the opportunity to meet the staff at Lifestart Foundation that year and share my academic journey, family situation and future plans with them. Each interview brought a mix of anxiety and excitement, and finally, joy and relief when my family received the notice for the next meeting. After two interview rounds, Ms. Karen informed us that we were the new scholarship recipients for that year. I can't forget the feeling of being frozen with joy and happiness; I couldn't believe my ears. In that moment, regardless of what the future held, I knew that I would still be able to attend school the following year and continue my educational journey without worrying too much about finances. The burdens on my mother's shoulders were lifted, and everyone understood that I didn't have to give up my dream anymore.

After receiving the scholarship, all major and minor expenses, such as tuition fees, school supplies, clothing, shoes, reference books and additional materials as well as my extra classes, were covered. Besides the scholarship for education, I was also provided with annual daily necessities like rice, spices, detergent and dishwashing liquid which significantly reduced my family's daily expenses. In particular, during the COVID-19 pandemic, the essential supplies from the Lifestart Foundation helped my family avoid facing food shortages. In 2020, Hoi An experienced severe natural disasters, and my family was no exception. After the Lifestart Foundation learned about the damage to our home, they promptly supported us with money for repairs. I am incredibly grateful for the timely assistance from the Lifestart Foundation.

In addition to the support for tuition fees and all school supplies, extra tuition fees were provided by the foundation, so I had the opportunity to participate in classes to prepare for the entrance exam to Le Thanh Tong High school for Gifted Students, something I had never dared to think about before. The person I am today is greatly shaped by the close management and timely guidance from the staff at Lifestart Foundation. They shared their invaluable experience with me when it came to choosing specialized subjects, selecting schools and deciding on university entrance exam blocks, ensuring that I did not feel lost when faced with many choices. I received their advice and changed my specialized subject from Math to English in 9th grade. I knew I had made the right decision as my academic performance in class remained strong, and ultimately, in 12th grade, I was directly admitted to the university I had always dreamt of.

The scholarship from Lifestart Foundation provided me with an environment to grow and realize what I needed and what I could contribute to society. It can be said that my current job is the result of a long process of training, reflection and assessing my own capabilities. I am very grateful for everything that has been given to me and for everything that has happened in my life up to now. Among them, the educational scholarship from Lifestart Foundation has always been the backbone and guiding light for every step I take on my educational journey.

Looking back on the journey so far, I know that getting to this point has not been easy. No matter how much effort I put in, my dreams would not have become a reality without the continuous support and companionship of Lifestart Foundation who helped me realize that education is the most important thing one can give to change a person's life. Today, I am a better version of myself, and I hope to bring that same improvement to my current students. I believe that a fulfilled life is one where you live according to your desires and take responsibility for yourself, and it becomes even more beautiful when you choose to share the values you have

The scholarship has supported Trang with educational expenses, rent, food costs, and learning materials, helping alleviate the financial burden on her family. Trang is an optimistic and energetic girl.

TRANG'S GRATITUDE LETTER:

Dear Ms Karen and the Lifestart Foundation.

This is Huynh Nguyen Huyen Trang, a 3rd-year student at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy, majoring in general medicine.

Over the past few days, I have been so touched and felt so lucky and happy to know that I was selected for the medical scholarship program run by the Lifestart Foundation. This is such a great support for my family and me, and it will help me overcome my current difficult situation. I appreciate this a great deal of support. Today, I am writing to express my deep thanks to you, my sponsors. And I hope that in the future there will be even more disadvantaged students having this wonderful opportunity to access better study conditions.

Speaking of my family, mine consists of four people: my parents, my younger brother and me. When I was very young, my father worked as a bricklayer while my mother sold coffee, and we all lived in a 10-square-meter house in a low-lying area. Every time a natural disaster came, our parents would take us to our grandmother's house to shelter from the storm. When there was a flood, our father would raise a four-legged bed and the whole family lived on it. Because the house was so degraded and the danger level was high, the city subsidized part of the cost of rebuilding our house, and the rest was money my parents borrowed. For several years, my father worked without getting paid to repay the debt, while my mother sold coffee alone to take care of the living expenses for four people.

Later, my mother also worked as a bricklayer with my father to pay off their debt and our school fees. My parents worked very hard to send two children to university. However, in the past year or so, my dad's health has deteriorated, and he has been to the emergency department a few times because of work accidents. My mum has a narrowing of the aortic valve in her heart and has had to go to many different places for treatment. Now she has had the valve replaced and must take medication for the rest of her life however she has completely lost the ability to work. Problems piled up when the tuition fees and living expenses for two children and the monthly medical expenses for my mum were all the sole responsibility of my father. To earn more income, my family also grows bananas, papayas and vegetables, but it is still not enough. My father's work is strenuous, his health declines and it is too much pressure when one person has to take care of the whole family's finances. Despite the circumstances, my parents still want us to continue studying so we can have jobs that are not as hard as theirs. I chose to study General Medicine which was a dream I had cherished since secondary school. Understanding the pressure that my family is under, I worried a lot about my study path ahead because I knew that my dad's modest income could not pay all the family's expenses. To share the burden on my parents, my younger brother, who has just entered university, had to work as a waiter to earn money to cover his own living expenses. I was also busy working part-time tutoring, however I had to take a break because the exam season was coming.

From information provided by the university, I learned about the Lifestart Foundation scholarship and decided to submit my application with great hope but also much anxiety. After finishing the interview in Hoi An, I was still nervous and restless even though Ms Karen and the team encouraged me a great deal. I kept wondering if I would be successful with this scholarship because I understood my circumstances and knew how much the scholarship would mean to me.



One morning, when I was on my clinical practice lesson at the hospital, Ms Nhung, who is the Lifestart Foundation manager, phoned me. I knew she had called me to inform me of the interview results because my friend who also attended the interview was excited to receive good news. I was so nervous and tried to find a quiet place to talk to Ms Nhung. After she congratulated me for being successful with the scholarship, I was bursting with all types of feelings, and I said thanks to her in a trembling voice. Finishing the phone chat, my head was still in the clouds. My parents were super delighted and cried with joy, and my mum spoke in a choked voice due to pent-up emotion. This scholarship means a great deal to my family and me. Receiving the support, our financial burden will be reduced a great deal. My parents will not need to worry too much about my study expenses anymore, even though the school fees have doubled. They can rest assured, take good care of themselves and will be able to support my younger brother. Thanks to the scholarship, my daily life will also be more comfortable as it will enable me to have decent meals every day without continually being concerned about running out of money. Having this scholarship means I will be able to totally focus on my study and develop myself instead of spending time doing a part-time job to get money. And I will no longer have to wonder whether I may have to give up on my study. This scholarship will be a motivation which will relieve the pressure on me and my studies and enable me to achieve more.

Currently, I am a third year student so I have started to go to the hospital more frequently for clinical practice. Hence my schedule is much busier and the knowledge I need to acquire is more than in previous years. To finish this semester smoothly, I have made some plans. Besides attending lessons, I will visit the hospital in the evening to learn more and complete my basic clinical skills. I will also spend 30 minutes per day or more studying English, to improve my foreign language skills. In the past, I had to think about and consider many issues, however now that I have received your support, I am brave enough to follow my dream which is to become a good doctor specialising in Neurology. I am always grateful that I was able to study medicine. Although I know this will be a winding road and my family still has many challenges, I also know that despite all that, there are always kind-hearted people full of affection like you who will support and accompany me, giving me more hope and courage to move forward into the future.

Last but not least, I would like to send my sincere thanks to Ms Karen and the Lifestart Foundation for supporting me. I will always try hard in my study and life and use the scholarship money for the right purposes and in the most efficient way, to be deserving of your support for me. I wish you all good health and good luck, and I hope that Lifestart Foundation will develop more and more, enabling you to continue your meaningful projects in the future.

I am Phan Thi Tu Oanh, a recent General Medicine graduate at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy.

Via this letter, I would like to tell you about my last semester, the results I achieved on my university journey and the numerous positive transformations in both my studies and personal life, as well as my family life during the period I have been fortunate enough to receive your scholarship. Furthermore, I would also like to extend my warmest regards and best wishes for good health to you, Ms Karen and the staff at Lifestart Foundation. As I reflect upon the journey behind me, I am filled with an immense sense of gratitude and good fortune for having had the scholarship as a companion, providing support and encouragement for me, thereby enabling me to successfully complete my studies and face the future with a heightened sense of confidence and optimism.

To begin with, I would like to tell you about last semester. When it came to the interview day, my emotions were so intense that I burst into tears during the interview with Ms. Karen. Those tears were for the hardships I had endured as well as my desire to receive the scholarship. When I received the confirmation that I had been awarded the scholarship, I was filled with immense joy and immediately called my parents to share the wonderful news. Since then, I have been fortunate to have Lifestart Foundation accompany me.

For me, the Lifestart Foundation scholarship had a profound impact on me and on my family's life. Thanks to the scholarship, our lives have undergone significant and positive changes. I no longer had to worry about financial issues and could devote all my energy and focus to my studies. The scholarship covered nearly all my educational and living expenses, providing me with peace of mind which allowed me to excel academically. Additionally, Lifestart Foundation also provided me with a laptop, greatly facilitating my ability to search out



and keep medical resources for my studies. With all this support, I could fully invest in my education and clearly define the path I would follow after graduation. Moreover, during times of natural disasters and pandemics, Lifestart Foundation also provided me with essential supplies, boosting my spirits to overcome the challenges. For my family, there was a significant change after receiving the scholarship as my parents no longer had to worry about me as much and could save money to repair our dilapidated house. NHUNG'S GRATITUDE LETTER:

Dear everyone at Lifestart Foundation,

My name is Dinh Thi Nhung, a third year student majoring in General Medicine at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy. Today, I am writing this letter to express my profound gratitude to you, Ms. Karen and the Lifestart Foundation for generously providing me with the opportunity to receive the Lifestart Foundation scholarship. I am aware that words alone cannot fully convey my gratitude, but I hope that the sincerity and appreciation from my family and I will reach you.

I was born and raised in Ha My Dong A, an area in Quang Nam province. My family includes 7 members, my parents, two older sisters, two younger brothers, and myself. My father works as a bricklayer, which is unstable employment in the rainy season. When he doesn't have work, he stays at home raising livestock with my mother. Previously, my mother worked as a gardener. However, after giving birth to my youngest brother, at the age of 39 following an unplanned pregnancy, her health started deteriorating with osteoarthritis. Over three years ago, she stopped her job and focus on raising pigs and chickens at home to earn an income. My eldest sister graduated from college and has been working in a restaurant for five years. She currently lives with our family. My second sister is married and has moved out of home. My younger brother, Hau, graduated from high school in 2022. He decided not to pursue a university education because he believed our family could not afford to support both me and him. Although our family did not agree with his decision, he remained determined and chose to pursue a freelance career. Currently, he is attending a hairdressing course in Da Nang. My youngest brother is in Year 3 now. Two months before the Tet holiday in 2023, my younger brother Hau unfortunately suffered a stroke while he was at the gym near our house and was immediately taken to the emergency room at Danang General Hospital. Receiving this news, everyone in my family was devastated, and I felt that my parents aged significantly overnight. The doctor estimated that the medical expenses for Hau would be substantial, about 500 million VND, for the implantation of an ICD (Implantable Cardioverter Defibrillator). At that time, my family was living on an average income, earning only enough for daily expenses and with savings of less than 100 million VND. My parents gathered all the money we had saved and tried to borrow from relatives, neighbors and friends to pay for the medical expenses for Hau. Fortunately, everyone in my village was very supportive, helping us with small as well as large amounts of money. The total we received was nearly 150 million VND. After a month of treatment at the hospital, thanks to everyone's generous support, my brother's health gradually improved, and he was discharged and sent home to be monitored there. The total cost for his treatment was around 240 million VND. Going through that difficult period, my family were deeply grateful to everyone in my hometown for their generous love and care and we will always remember and cherish their kindness.

After high school, I was not certain about what I wanted to do in the future. I chose to study Medicine because my parents wanted someone in the family to become a doctor and I passed the medical entrance exams. However, since the incident, I have been determined to study hard in order to become a well-qualified doctor in the future and serve the community. I believe that education is the best path that will provide me with opportunities and a brighter future to help my family. When I learned about the Lifestart Foundation scholarship, I decided to challenge myself and submit my application. I was truly anxious when I was called for an interview at Lifestart Foundation. At that time, I did not know what to do to convince the interviewer to select me. However, when I met Ms. Karen and the staff, I felt much more comfortable as everyone was friendly, kind and cared about my story. I tried my best to answer all the questions about the struggles my family encountered, my study plan and my future goals. After the interview, I was really worried whether my performance was good enough.

After a period of nervous waiting, I felt unbelievable joy when finally receiving the news that I had been awarded the Lifestart Foundation scholarship. It was a great joy not only for me, but also my entire family. I immediately called home to share the good news, which made them extremely overjoyed and proud of me. Though I spoke to them on the phone, I could feel my parents' happiness vividly. My parents do not know how to express their



gratitude to you other than sending their thanks to you, Ms. Karen and the Lifestart Foundation for providing me with a better educational opportunity.

The scholarship has a profound meaning for me and my family, serving as a precious gift that will enable me to study more effectively and help cover my daily living expenses. It also alleviates the financial burdens on my parents, especially now that the tuition fees have increased, and allows them to provide better care for the family and my younger brother. For me, this is not only a great source of material support but also a spiritual encouragement, motivating me to overcome challenges and the pressures of my studies, leaving me with less worries and enabling me to concentrate on studying and developing myself.

Currently, I am working hard, aiming to achieve excellent results this semester. 

A HAMPER BOX AND MILK DONATION FOR TRIEU

As well as supporting disadvantaged students with education scholarships that provide all tuition fees, books, stationery, uniforms, and the all-important extra classes, the Lifestart Foundation education scholarship project also provides the students with additional support. This comes in a variety of practical and useful ways to help ease the burden for the students and their families.

Our Education Scholarship student Trieu is currently studying in Year 10. He has held a full Lifestart Foundation scholarship since grade 9. Trieu spends 5 hours a day self-studying, which is in addition to his classes at school and extra classes. Like other Vietnamese children, he also spends 1 hour a day helping his sister with household chores. At this stage, Trieu would like to pursue a career in the Information Technology sector.

Trieu is pictured receiving a donation of a much-needed hamper box and milk. The milk boxes and hamper box includes rice and daily household necessities such as fish sauce, cooking oil, toilet paper rolls, salt, shampoo. These are the items that many of us often take for granted, but for our students who come from disadvantaged families, these can be a luxury.

Like other children in our Education Scholarship project, Trieu's childhood was a very sad and difficult story. Trieu hails from a financially challenged family of 3, including his sister, his niece, and himself. Unfortunately, both of his parents lost their lives to cancer several years ago, leaving Trieu and his sister living in a small house. During Trieu's childhood, he faced kidney-related health issues, resulting in him having poor health. The financial responsibilities of his medical issues fell on Trieu's sister's shoulders. Trieu's sister was in an unhappy marriage, so she and her four-year-old daughter returned to her parent's home to ensure she could provide safety, care and support for both Trieu and her child. To support their livelihood, Trieu's sister works selling vegetables at the market. Her wage is about 100,000 VND per day (approximately \$5 USD). However, due to the responsibilities of caring for Trieu and her daughter, she is unable to work regularly. Consequently, her income is highly unstable and insufficient to cover the living expenses of the family. Fortunately, since Trieu received the Lifestart Foundation scholarship, his family life has improved. The gift of a hamper box not only supports Trieu but also helps to reduce the burden on his sister's shoulders.

Born in China in 1931 to pharmacist parents, Dr. Geok Hua Wong endured significant challenges early in life. Amidst political turmoil and war, his family relocated to Singapore around 1940. During the Japanese occupation of Singapore in 1942, Dr. Wong, then just 12 years old, and his parents were detained in Changi Prison. Despite the hardships of internment, Dr. Wong cultivated a deep passion for learning, using every resource available to him.

After their release in 1945, Dr. Wong spent a few years in Singapore before traveling alone to Melbourne in 1949 at the age of 18 to pursue higher education. He graduated as a doctor from the University of Melbourne in 1955 and later specialized in Psychiatry. Over a distinguished career spanning public hospitals and private practice, Dr. Wong also provided expert testimony in high-profile criminal cases.

Beyond his medical career, Dr. Wong was a devoted patron of the arts, with his name inscribed as a major donor at the National Gallery of Victoria. Following his passing in 2015, a Trust was established to continue his legacy of generosity.

Honoring a Generous Supporter and Benefactor

Edward Scott Smith (Eddie) 1941 - 2022

Eddie was an extraordinary supporter of Lifestart Foundation's initiatives, including medical scholarships, clean water projects, life-saving medical equipment for

Danang Women's and Children's Hospital, support for orphans, bicycle donations, and emergency food hampers. These are just some of the many wonderful donations over the years.

The Lifestart Foundation team will be forever grateful for Eddie's unwavering support, his kindness, and his enduring legacy, where he has left provisions in his will to continue his philanthropy and the funding of future projects. Eddie Smith, affectionately known as Eddie, was born in Coventry, UK, in 1941. Leaving school at the age of 15, he began an electrical apprenticeship that laid the foundation for his remarkable journey. In his late teens, he discovered a passion for boxing, excelling in the ring and winning most of his matches. This fighting spirit served him well in later years as he navigated the competitive Australian corporate world, where he often "punched above his weight."

In 1965, Eddie embarked on a life-changing journey to Australia. Travel at the time was an adventure; his flight took a week, stopping in South Africa, Singapore, and finally arriving in Perth, Western Australia. Wasting no time, Eddie found a job and accommodation almost immediately. He joined the Hammersley Rail Project in the remote Pilbara region, working in Dampier and living in a tent. He spent eight months at Camp 60, wiring the camp and its generators.

Eddie's next adventure took him to Saigon, Vietnam, where he worked at the airport. This experience sparked a lifelong connection to Vietnam and its people.

After gaining invaluable experience, Eddie established his own electrical contracting company, Elcos, which operated successfully from Western Australia, and expanded to Queensland. Later, he transitioned to a second highly successful career in the oil and gas industry.

Eddie faced significant health challenges, including surviving bowel cancer and, later, a major heart attack in 2009. His heart was severely damaged, requiring a transplant for long-term survival. In December 2009, he received the gift of a new heart, allowing him to embrace a new chapter of life.

Following his recovery, Eddie dedicated himself to philanthropy, supporting numerous charities both in Australia and abroad. He became a major donor to the Fiona Stanley Heart and Lung Transplant Foundation, the Fred Hollows Foundation, and many others. In 2013, Eddie founded the Karma Foundation, a registered charitable trust to support causes in Vietnam, Cambodia, Bali, and Laos.

Eddie's connection to Vietnam deepened over the years, with frequent visits and hands-on involvement in philanthropic projects. His admiration for the resilience and history of the Vietnamese people fueled his efforts.



Known for his resourcefulness and intellect, Eddie combined his expertise as an electrician with astute business acumen. A self-educated and well-read man with a "get-it-done" attitude, Eddie was generous to those in need, always relating to their struggles.

Even in passing, Eddie's generosity endures. True to his character, he established a trust fund to ensure his philanthropic legacy would continue well beyond his lifetime.
